Summary Report:

CONSORTIUM'20, the annual flagship event of The Commerce Association, Sri Venkateswara College began with a bang! All the society members were filled with immense enthusiasm to make Consortium a huge success. The muchawaited event started with a lamp lighting ceremony graced by the esteemed speakers, faculty members and the core team to seek the blessings of the almighty and kick start on a positive note. Then the teachers presented saplings to the speakers as a token of gratitude. Before the speakers took to the podium, Mrs. Shruti and Mr. Venkata addressed the audience respectively and briefed them about the college and the commerce society.

The speaker session commenced with the first speaker as Mr. Saurabh Jain, Vice President, Paytm who interacted with the students about entrepreneurship and told them about his personal life experiences. He reminisced about studying in the South Campus in his youth and told how the exposure helped him become who he is now. He started his interaction by posing a question to the audience asking "why entrepreneurship?". He was amazed by the responses and found the right answer among the audience too. The answer simply being passion. Entrepreneurship is not about becoming a billionaire but is about a fire within to solve the problems of the society. He also advised

the students to inculcate the habit of reading, having himself read around more than 180 books till date. One book he mentioned the most and suggested to read was the "Purple Cow" which makes one understand the importance of being unique and not the ordinary white cow. He also expressed his views on the glass ceiling created by the society between engineers and non-engineers when it comes to entrepreneurship. According to him, knowledge about one subject or stream is nothing in the current scenario, one should learn as many skills and subjects as possible. He himself did CA and also learned programming side by side, both being completely different from each other. Then he talked about the "Theory of Multiple Intelligences" and explained all the 8 intelligences properly giving the students a fair insight about them. In the end, he motivated everyone to not keep their ideas to themselves as "Number 1 thing with bad ideas is they are actually good ideas."



The next speaker to amaze the audience was Mr. Rakshit Tandon, Director Executive, CIS who brought another interesting topic to the table. He sensitized the students about cyber-crimes and cyber laws. He started the first cyber-crime cell in the state of Uttar Pradesh. He loves talking to children apart from serving the nation as a cyber-crime expert. He also talked about his recent initiative which is a programme called "Cyber Surakshit" to help as many as possible from cybercrimes. He mentioned how lack of education and weak law enforcement is responsible for all the cyber-crimes that are happening. People unknowingly do so many things on a regular basis that result in these crimes like having weak passwords, sharing bank account details to anyone who sounds professional on call, believing in lotteries etc. He shared so many cases with the students that shocked each one of them. One of them being of an actress from Mumbai whose Instagram account got hacked and the hacker started posting ads of expensive electronic devices being sold for much cheaper prices. Many fans trusted the advertisements because they were posted on an account with a 'blue tick' and got defrauded. Another one being of a girl who was black mailed by a guy with whom she broke up using her pictures and texts. With a few more cases and scams like these, he enlightened the audience about various precautions they should take while using internet and also told them how they can seek help in case of any fraud or injury. The students were

completely stunned and felt that the session was very informative for them and greeted the speaker with loud claps.
