Activity Report

Economics association organises a series of activities throughout the year to make the process of learning interesting and relevant. Among these are the Distinguished Lecture Series (DLS). Lectures by eminent personalities in the field of economics are brilliant opportunities for us students to hear and interact with intellectuals and luminaries in their fields. This is with an objective to provide the students of economics with necessary insights into reality. Various distinguished personalities like Dr. Shankar Acharya, Dr. C Rangarajan, Dr. Manmohan Singh have visited our college in the past few years.

The latest in the series of DLS was a lecture by Professor Pinaki Chakraborty . The GST session which also happened to be the first distinguished lecture series of the semester promised a lot, as opportunities to learn the tricks of the trade, from a true veteran is hard to come by. Professor Chakraborty took the students through the intricacies of GST, which is a highly debated and discussed tax reform doing the rounds in media today. Professor Chakraborty had this uncanny knack of transforming the otherwise complicated and unfathomable concept into a much simplified version, which we as amateur or upcoming economists could decipher to the best of our abilities. The lecture gave students a first-hand information regarding GST through the viewpoint of the dexterous speaker. Professor Chakraborty also went onto state why GST is not actually the biggest tax reform in India, contrary to popular view. The biggest takeaway of the lecture was the sheer simplicity with which Professor Chakraborty drilled down the entire ambit of GST which simple examples. Students had the sheer privilege of getting to understand how GST would subsume various other indirect taxes, how the revenues among centre and state would be shared, what are the activities in the value adding chain that would actually be taxed and a gamut of significant phenomena pertaining to GST. The lecture gave concrete evidence as to why a mere passing of ordinance or an amendment of constitutional law doesn't surmount to be the 'biggest tax reform in independent India'. Moreover the students got to learn a lot more about the subject of economics other than GST, the concept of value added was discussed in great detail by the speaker with a high degree of alacrity. Going by tradition, the floor was later on opened for questions, where the thirst of knowledge regarding this dynamic tax reform was quenched by the wisdom of the speaker. The Q&A session did address the biggest question everyone had in their mind, what or how will a productive service be taxed under the GST system? The students too had their fair share of uncertainty and doubt regarding the possibilities that GST opens up for bolstering growth in the Indian economy, and how this move will change productivity in the country. In one word, the lecture could be described as 'enriching', for this lecture made one to go through the tedious task of understanding a tax reform in the most simple and effective way.
