BRIEF INFORMATION ABOUT THE ACTIVITY

TOPIC/SUBJECT OF THE ACTIVITY	Movie screening Battleship Potempkin based on the background of the Russian Revolution
OBJECTIVES	To familiarize students with the background of the Russian Revolution, including societal, economic, political, and cultural aspects of the Russian Empire before the revolution. I screened a movie named "Battleship Potemkin" directed by Sergei Eisenstein, a Soviet director, well–known for his propaganda movies and the technique of montage. IN quick succession images of ordinary people, soldiers, and sailors of Tsar's army are shown juxtaposed with those of high officials and military commanders to show the vast gap between the rulers and the ruled. The compelling images of conflict create sympathy and support for the rebels Sergei Eisenstein filmed a significant sequence in the port city of Odessa, where we can easily find out how not only the men but women, teenagers, and senior citizens joined the rebellion for various reasons familiarising students with the idea of social base, strategies, and tactics, aims and ideology of the revolution in an accessible manner.
