- Healing Does Not Occur In A Smooth Line or On A Time Table:
 Healing occurs in phases where you move in and out of different feelings. Remind yourself that you can get through this.
- · Alternate between "loss" and " restorative" activities
- Expect Relapses:
 There will always be certain things that trigger sadness again. This is normal.
- Develop new rituals to cope with the loss
- Make plans to help you feel more in control

Event Report

National Service Scheme unit of Sri Venkateswara College organised a webinar on COPING WITH GRIEF AND LOSS IN AFTERMATH OF COVID- 19 in collaboration with MGNCRE, SVC Psychological post COVID support on 4th September 2021. The aim of this webinar was to spread awareness among people about how to deal with grief and loss.

The speaker of the webinar was Dr Kimneihat Vaiphei, Assistant Professor, Department of Psychiatric Social Work, NIMHANS, Bengaluru. The panelists included Dr. Vandana Joshi and Dr. Haokam Thomas Vipe.

The webinar commenced with Dr. Kimneihat Vaiphei discussing grief, its complexities, and various reactions in relation to COVID 19. She elucidated grief as something which is universal, inevitable and as a natural reaction to loss and any kind of change. " Grief during this time is an intense and traumatic experience as many people lost their loved ones, freedom of movement and feeling of stability." explained Dr. Vaiphei in reference to COVID-19 aftermath. She shedded some light to sensitive aspects of losing someone and how it affects us - physically and psychologically. Furthermore, she covered the next segment stating various stages of grief and the whole process which is subjective according to the person.

Moving on, she stressed on the fact that relieving your feelings is a wonderful mechanism to cope up with the loss instead of bottling up. There were some insightful methods to identify whether someone needs extra support outside of talking about stress and trauma. With this, she also shared some resources for those struggling with emotional loss, including acknowledging emotions, seeking professional help, performing restorative activities, etc. Alongside, self-care, exercising, social media detox are some other ways to balance one's thoughts.

The webinar was quite interactive and enlightening. A lot of questions were answered mindfully by Dr. Kimneihat Vaiphei and got tremendous response from attendees as well. Audiences understood that one should not suppress or avoid our feelings. The essence and key takeaway were to be patient and allow the process to naturally unfold in order to heal from trauma.

NSS SVC was honoured to host the session and we look forward to more such webinars in future.
