





Impressionism, which was once dismissed by critics, has subsequently come to be recognised as one of the most popular and important art movements in Western history. It was a feast of vision that connected us to history. I'll start by saying that I adore all types of art, but paintings by the masters are my favourites, and the Impressionist period and artists are the cream of the crop for me. It doesn't stop there. The lighting and arrangement of the scenes - many of which are created in such a manner that they appear to be living works of art - were particularly appealing to me. It was simple to see why light, shadow, and colour were more appealing to modern painters than the form and posture of older masters. These details are not found in a conventional art book, and it is especially wonderful because the author takes you to areas of significance - where painters lived or where they produced a certain work. The author also discusses the "why and how" certain painting methods were only conceivable at that time and not at any other moment in history, and he informs us about the materials and conditions that made it possible. This miniseries was both surprisingly realistic and enjoyable to watch. Because it is outside of the covers, I highly suggest this series to all art enthusiasts.

It was Seurat who developed this technique of using colour dots instead of colour strokes on Canvas. He studied and experimented the pseudo-scientific effect of colour combination which human eye perceive. Waldemar throws light upon two of Seurat's paintings which when compared side by side come as two different parts of the same picture. It clearly shows the classification that the society had with upper class being on the left side of the river and the working class on the right.

Impressionism not only questioned the traditional method of teaching art and accepting a work as a piece of art on certain restricted grounds, but also brought to the light the realities of the society. It was very much inviting to the new ideas and experiments which altogether contributed in the development of this new form of art.
