4. Parliament Visit Report

DEPARTMENT OF HISTORY EXCURSION REPORT

Date: 25th November, 2022.

On the 23rd of November, 2022, a group of over fifty students from the three odd semesters of the Department of History went to visit the Parliament House where we were accompanied by Professor Dr. Ningmuanching. The group were hosted by the Parliamentary Research and Training Institute for Democracies (PRIDE) represented by Mr Daniel Peshai, currently serving at the Lok Sabha Secretariat who escorted them inside the premises after a thorough and rigorous security check where all electronic gadgets were withheld. As per the Covid guidelines which are still operational inside the house, such visits can only be conducted when the chambers of the Parliament are not in session.

The students were first taken to the Lok Sabha- the Lower House or the House of the People and thereafter to the Rajya Sabha- the Upper House of the Council of States where the students were enlightened about the importance of both these houses and other significant details like the strength and composition of the house, presiding officers, mode of election, seating arrangements and the recently adopted technological infrastructure to ease voting for and against bills or resolutions by members of the house. The issues discussed were far-ranging and touched upon the minutest of things like the reasons for using the iconic red and green carpets in the Rajya Sabha and Lok Sabha respectively and the translation of speeches from vernaculars to the official languages of the house-Hindi or English. The group was thereafter led to the historic Central Hall, through the lawns and corridors of the Parliament which were donned with paintings and statues of the luminaries who had guided India and its destiny. Unlike the two houses, where the students were seated in their respective public galleries, they were directly led into the Central Hall which besides its current usage as a chamber for Joint Sessions during the Presidential Address, visits by foreign dignitaries and other special occasions had a historic role in housing the Constituent Assembly who had met eleven times between 9th December 1946 to 26th November 1949 to draw up India's Constitution in this hall. The historic significance of this chamber stirred up students to enquire about events that defined the spirit of the house like Bhagat Singh and Batukeshwar Dutt's heroic deeds of dropping bombs in the then Central Legislative Council in 1929 or the heroic resistance offered by our security forces during the 2001 attacks on the Parliament. Fascinated by the inverted fan dotting the Central Hall, they also expressed keen interest about the fate of this complex once the new Parliament is inaugurated. Besides these, the students also asked about the methods of recruitments to the Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha Secretariats.

After a brief round of refreshments, the students were led to the Parliament Library which besides commanding a huge impressive stock of literary material like books, parliamentary proceedings, bills and acts even before independence, journals, magazines also housed a copy of the original Constitution of India. However due to works of renovation, the staff were unable to showcase them to the students. The tour ended with two documentaries being screened, the first in English touching upon the process of the Constitution-making and the second in Hindi that awed the students with images and artist' impressions of the new Parliament building and the architectural concepts that are so deeply-rooted in India's past and ethos.

It was therefore a highly enjoyable and educative afternoon for the students of whom some even expressed their wish to visit again soon but then as elected representatives! The temple of democracy thus succeeded in facilitating the young minds to dream big who would one day take the nation to even greater heights.
