Activity Report on the field trip organized By Nuti Namita Maam to Red Fort, Delhi.

Date: 7th November, 2019

The trip was organized on 7th November 2019, a sunny, pleasant morning. Twenty-five of us assembled on the foreground of the Lal-qila at 10.30 sharp. Most of us had commuted by Metro. Nuti Ma'am was already there waiting for us with a government authorized guide. He took us inside and explained to us in great detail about the significance of different structures. We entered through the Lahori gate of the fort and then we were in the Meena bazaar, the hustle bustle of it made us feel invigorated. The guide then took us to the Museums which were relevant for our course. We got to see artifacts, weapons, photos, clothes etc. Of the Mughal period. A particular artifact was of great interest. This was an old, worn-down shirt which was supposedly worn by the last Mughal Emperor in the end days of his rule in 1857. It was supposed to be a holy shirt sent from Mecca for bestowing good fortune on the Mughals. However, in September 1857, when the British were successful in reconquering Delhi and Bahadur Shah Zafar had to flee from his abode in Lal Qila, he discarded this holy shirt within the premises. It was later discovered by a British family who then sold it to the ASI. This historical shirt was displayed in the museum. Then we went on to see the Diwan-i-Aam, and the Diwan-i-Khas. The pietra dura panels in the walls which had been looted during the revolt had been restored to a certain extent. The magnificence of the zafar mahal, rang mahal and the jharokha were so spellbinding. The guide very patiently explained the historical importance of different structures, when it was actually built and how during British control many structures were demolished within the Red Fort and the building of ugly barrack like buildings for housing the military. We had lots of fun, photo-ops as well as immense learning experience.

Diwan-i-Khas

Diwan-i-Khas also known as Shah Mahal was the Hall of Private Audience used by the Emperor for receiving selected courtiers and visitors.

It consists of a rectangular central chamber, surrounded by series of arches rising from piers. The lower parts of the piers are inlaid with floral designs, while the upper portions are gilded and painted. The four corners of its roof are surmounted by pillared chhatris. Over the marble pedestal in its centre stood the famous Peacock Throne which was removed in 1739 by Nadir Shah. Through the centre of the hall flowed the Nahr-i-Bihisht (Stream of Paradise). Over the corner arches of the northern and southern walls below the cornice is inscribed the famous verse of Amir Khusrau exclaiming "If there be a paradise on the earth, it is this, it is this, it is this".



Rang Mahal

The Rang Mahal or the 'Palace of Colours' consists of a large hall, originally painted on the interior from which it derives its name. This was the largest of the royal apartments and was also called Imtiyaz Mahal (Palace of Distinction).

It is divided into six apartments by engraved arches set on piers. The northern and southern ends of the Rang Mahal are known as 'Saish Mahal' (House of mirrors) and contain marble dados. Over the walls and ceilings of these apartments are embedded tiny pieces of mirrors, which reflect light and create a picturesque effect. Through the centre along its length flowed the channel known as Nahr-i-Bihisht (stream of paradise). In its centre is a marble basin, which is said to have been provided originally with an ivory fountain.

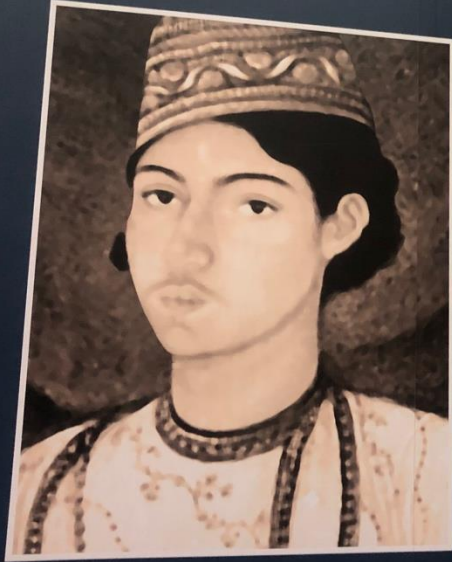
Princes Shot In Cold Blood: September 22, 1857

लगभग तीन हज़ार अनुयायियों ने शाहज़ादों से विनती की कि वह हडसन से युद्ध करें, जो अगली सुबह फिर से वापस आ गया था। मिर्ज़ा मुग़ल, खिज़र सुल्तान और मिर्ज़ा अबू बक्र ने निःशर्त आत्मसमर्पण कर दिया। खूनी दरवाज़े के पास उनके कपड़े उतार कर हडसन ने उन्हें गोलियों से भून दिया। बादशाह के प्रिय हिजड़े को भी टुकड़े-टुकड़े काट डाला गया। उनके जवाहरात लूट लिए गए और शवों को चाँदनी-चौक में छोड़ दिया गया।

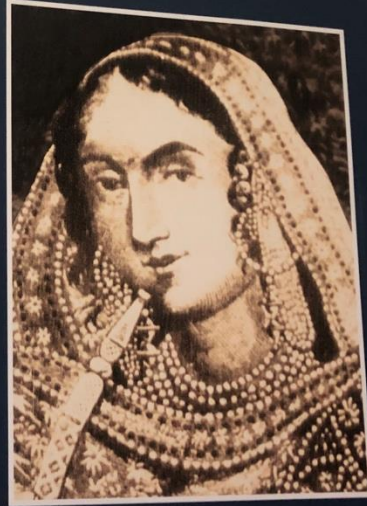
The princes were being begged by their 3,000 followers to fight Hodson, who was back again the next morning. Mirza Mughal, Mirza Khizr Sultan and Mirza Abu Bakr surrendered unconditionally. On nearing the Khooni Darwaza, Hodson, after stripping off their clothes, shot the princes dead. The Badshah's favourite eunuch was also cut to pieces. Their gems were looted and their corpses left in Chandni Chowk.

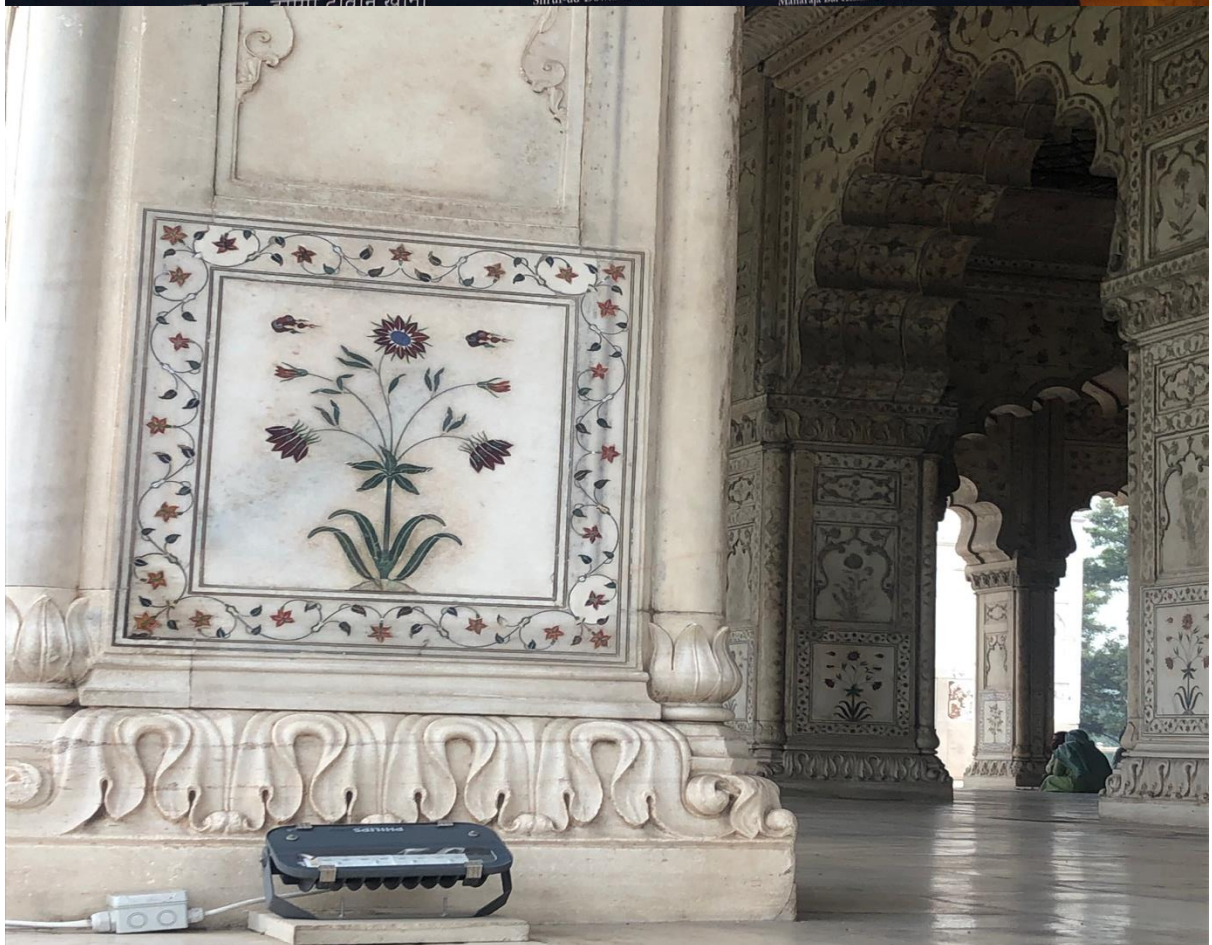
