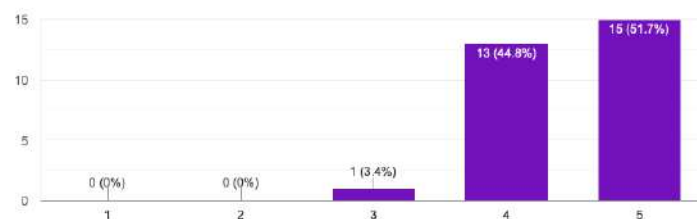

Vrittant Day-1

Panel discussion on “AUKUS and its impact on the Indo-Pacific”.

On the 26th of October, 2021 the Department of Political Science, Sri Venkateswara College inaugurated Vrittant #VocalisingVision, a 3-day virtual conclave celebrating the diamond jubilee event of the college.

The event was hosted by Kirti Singh who commenced the event by inviting the Teacher-in-charge, Dr. Jita Mishra for addressing the audience and welcoming everyone to Vrittant. This was followed by the principal ma'am, Prof. C. Sheela Reddy's speech wherein she welcomed the Chief guest for the day Prof. P.C. Joshi, Pro-vice chancellor of University of Delhi, the panellists, moderator, faculty and the audience. Principal ma'am also applauded the efforts of the Political Science Students' Association for organising the event on a virtual platform and bringing eminent scholars and professionals on a single platform. Then the chief guest inaugurated Vrittant with their speech and extended their warm regards to everyone present in the event.

After the chief guest's speech, Kirti Singh handed over the further proceedings to the moderator for the day, **Prof. Bimal Prasad Mohapatra**, Research Fellow at the Defence Research and Studies (DRaS), also Assistant Professor of Management Studies (Marketing) in Trident Group of Institutions. Bimal sir introduced the topic of the panel discussion "*AUKUS and its impact on the Indo-Pacific*" with their insights and then introduced the panellists. The panellists for the discussion were: **Prof. Ian Hall**, Professor at the School of Government and International Relations, Griffith University, and an Academic Fellow at the Australia India Institute, University of Melbourne; **Prof. V. Yoga Jyotsna**, Honorary Adjunct Fellow with the National Maritime Foundation-India; **Abhijit Singh**, a former naval officer and the Head of the Maritime Policy Initiative at Observer Research Foundation (ORF) New Delhi; and **Ambassador Nalin Surie**, a distinguished Fellow at the Delhi Policy Group.

The panel discussion began with the opening remarks from the speakers. Prof. Ian Hall talked about the emergence of the issue in depth by covering the points-why was the AUKUS agreement introduced in the first place; Australia's need for submarines, the immediate issue of the failure of the Australia-France nuclear-powered submarines deal, the role of Japan, United Kingdom and the United States in this situation; the intensified bilateral competition between U.S and China and the Sino-centric Indo-Pacific economy; Britain's pivot towards the Indo-Pacific, the advantage of the region and the post-Brexit energy diversion; and finally they talked about other focus areas of AUKUS including the information technology and supply chains. Prof. V. Yoga Jyotsna gave a presentation through the lens of the maritime security policy of India. They talked about the formation of AUKUS; China-Australia relationship; Quad not being sufficiently military oriented; the expansionist tendencies of an ambitious China in the Indian Ocean region; how AUKUS would reshape the dynamics of the Indo-Pacific region; maritime capabilities of India; India-France alliance in this new dynamic; the effect of AUKUS on a dominant China in the Indo-Pacific Region and the Quad; the economic situation of the Indo-Pacific; and finally they talked about how the importance of Navies across the globe would rise with the nuclear-powered submarine technology gaining momentum. Abhijit Singh talked about how AUKUS will be doing the heavy lifting due to its complicated proposition and how it will alter the strategic order in the Indo-Pacific region. They talked about the views of the sceptics on AUKUS in terms of the alienation of France by the western alliance and the difficulty India would face in terms of balancing its relations with Beijing in the current situation. They also elaborated on how AUKUS will try to implement a rules-based equitable order in the Indo-Pacific which would be applied more in the Pacific region as compared to the Indian Ocean region and the response of China in this cross-play of power in the Indo-Pacific region and its implications on India. They also talked about how they believe that AUKUS complements Quad and that they reinforce one another. As Quad has both the security and non-security aspects, it will surely maintain a fair balance in the region. Ambassador Nalin Surie examined the role of China in the entire situation and pointed out its inexorable nature. According to them AUKUS is trying to address the long-term problem of the Indo-Pacific and has several versions in terms of the narratives presented by diverse countries involved in the picture. They also talked about the Anglo-Saxon connection between U.S, U.K, and Australia; Quad's potential of becoming a catalyst in the Indo-Pacific region, and how Russia's role should not be ignored but observed at a closer distance.

The discussion as moderated by Prof. Mohapatra also tried to answer certain questions like- "Will the coming in of AUKUS bring a second cold war?", "Can other countries also join this arrangement?" and also covered the aspects of the role of organizations like the European Union in the scenario. The insights and knowledge of the panelists made the panel discussion into a very enriching, engaging, and holistic session for the audience. The panel discussion was followed by a fruitful Q/A session wherein the audience members asked their questions to the speakers. The event was concluded with the formal vote of thanks

delivered by the President of the department, Shivam Kumar who thanked the panelists, the moderator, faculty members, the event coordinators, and the audience for making the event a huge success.

Speaker Session on “Feminist Foreign Policy- A long road for India”

On the 27th of October, 2021 the Department of Political Science, Sri Venkateswara College executed Part 2 of Vrittant #VocalisingVision, a 3-day virtual conclave celebrating the diamond jubilee event of the college. The event was hosted by Manika Khandelwal who commenced the event by inviting the head of the Political Science Department, Ms. Namita Pandey for addressing the audience and welcoming everyone to Vrittant. This was followed by a speaker session by **Ms. Priyanka Bhide**, *Co-founder, and Director of Kubernein Initiative, on the topic, “Feminist Foreign Policy: A long road for India”*.

She started off by talking about human rights in the international arena and how much they coincide with a country like India. She insisted on more women coming to the decision-making tables and discussing matters of importance so that a gendered perspective can be adequately applied to different situations. The need to make spaces more acceptable and welcoming to all the people alike, making them grow in a broader perspective, was explained along with the role of stakeholders involved. She expressed that only making policies isn't enough, the need is to make them optimally inclusive.

She discussed the situation of different countries like Canada, Sweden with respect to the topic and also briefly explained the National Action Plan as laid out by Mexico. She suggested that gender experts and intellectuals (field-based) be included in negotiations, in collecting and organizing databases, and also in making decisions of importance.

With this, she welcomed questions from the audience which lead to a fruitful and knowledgeable Q/A session. The event was concluded with the formal vote of thanks delivered by the Vice President of the department, Pragya Pandey who thanked the speaker, faculty members, the event coordinators, and the audience for making the event a huge success.

Panel discussion on “Patriarchal Meanderings of Indian Judiciary In The Context Of Representation Of Women”.

On the 28th of October, 2021 the Department of Political Science, Sri Venkateswara College successfully executed the final panel discussion of Vrittant #VocalisingVision, a 3-day virtual conclave celebrating the diamond jubilee event of the college. The event was hosted by Jayita Pal who commenced the event by inviting principal ma'am, Prof C.Sheela Reddy for addressing the audience and welcoming everyone to Day 3 of Vrittant. Principal ma'am applauded the efforts of the Political Science Students' Association for organizing the event on a virtual platform and bringing eminent scholars and professionals on a single platform. After Principal Maa's speech, Jayita Pal handed over the further proceedings to the moderator for the day, Dhruv Sood, a practicing Advocate in Punjab and Haryana High Court. Dhruv Sood introduced the topic of the panel discussion "PATRIARCHAL MEANDERINGS OF INDIAN JUDICIARY IN THE CONTEXT OF REPRESENTATION OF WOMEN" and further introduced the panelists. The panelists for the discussion were: Satya Pal Jain, Additional Solicitor General of India, a practicing Senior Advocate in the Supreme Court of India and the Punjab and Haryana High Court at Chandigarh; Prof. (Dr.) Shashikala Gurpur, Director of Symbiosis Law School, Pune and Dean of the Faculty of Law, Symbiosis International University; Amrita S Nair, Advocate at the Bombay High Court, Founder of The Silent Sexism Project and

the Intersectional Feminist Magazine; and Prof. Srikrishna Deva Rao, the Vice-Chancellor of National Law University Delhi.

The panel discussion began with the opening remarks from the speakers. Dr. Satya Pal Jain began by talking about the positive role of women in history, taking examples from epics such as Mahabharata and Ramayana. He insisted on the representation of women not only in the apex responsibilities but also at all possible levels. Further, Dr. Shashikala continued on the words of Satya Pal sir questioning why was there no concept of women coming to or being offered the throne. She spoke on the need for women to come from the periphery to the core and the forces involved in this whole process. She even shared her law school experience hinting at the percentage of women dropping out of education on getting married. The underrepresentation, exclusion, and denial of/to women represented some major problems. The patriarchal mindset of man as the 'provider' and women as the 'sacrificer' raised concern. She also pointed out that not only gender inequality was the issue; caste differentiations within women posed another problem.

Prof. Rao spoke about the general deficit of women's representation not only in the judiciary but across various systems. He focussed on the conscious choice to promote women's representation than just mere words. Citing B.K. Pavitra's case, insisted on substantive equality rather than formal equality. He felt that the collegium needs to come forward in promoting equitable representation and should come out with principles and statements.

Amrita S. Nair, regarded the Judiciary as the custodian of rights and elaborated on the intersectional aspect concerning caste, the economic law, and the male point of view spanning across. She advised us to be assertive and not let something deter. The target, according to her, is better progressive judgments of patriarchy.

The discussion as moderated by Dhruv Sood discussed how paradigm shift takes time, the concept of physical tokenism, the patriarchal inclination of supreme court museums, the need to criminalize marital rapes, and the need to create a healthy culture of discussion, forming groups and discussion forums.

The panel discussion was followed by a fruitful Q/A session wherein the audience members asked their questions to the speakers. The 3-day event was concluded with the formal vote of thanks delivered by the Vice President of the department, Pragya Pandey who thanked the panelists, the moderator, faculty members, the event coordinators, and the audience for making the event a huge success.
