


Venerable Baa,



- Please check your grammar and punctuation before submitting the entry.
- Plagiarism is strictly prohibited.
- Participants have to submit their entries through the google form provided before the deadline i.e. 8th April,2022.
- In case of any discrepancies, the decision of the organizing team will be considered final.
