The Minister of Education also presented mementoes to the Principal and Chairman of Sri Venkateswara College. Prof. Yogesh Singh spoke about the previous ties between Australia and the University in the form of 3 Memorandums of Understanding with University of Melbourne, University of Wollongong and Macquarie University. He expressed deep appreciation for both the education ministers to initiate a collaborative teaching learning process on

the lines of internationalization. Vice Chancellor informed the audience that last Sunday, 25<sup>th</sup> Feb, 2023 only University of Delhi hosted the 99<sup>th</sup> Convocation. President of India, Smt. Draupadi Murmi was present at the convocation and 1,57,290 degrees were awarded for the academic year 2021-22 which included 910 Ph.Ds., the highest number of Ph.Ds. any University has ever awarded. He also emphasized since India is presiding over G20 this year, dual degree programmes, joint projects, joint research initiatives shall be at the forefront of the summit in the field of education. This very event shall be the beginning of such collaborations which shall make students global and responsible citizens.

Shri Dharmendra Pradhan Ji emphasized that India and Australia share some common things, though the size of both countries is different but the roadmap and aspirations are similar. He said, "I have observed the development of Australia for last 50 years very closely, the country had a focus on skill development." He also informed everyone that this was the first public programme of Mr. Clare in India. Asserting that India and Australia are deepening ties through two-way mobility to fulfil 21st-century aspirations, Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan said that two Australian universities- Wollongong and Deakin will soon establish campuses in Gujarat. He emphasised that, India is implementing NEP 2020, affordability, accessibility and quality being at the forefront of NEP 2020. He further said that strengthening educational linkages will provide opportunities for students from both countries to learn and gain new experiences in diverse cultural settings, thereby truly upholding the values of "Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam" or "One Earth, One Family and One Future", which is also the theme of India's G20 Presidency.

- The incoming Secretary of Australia's Department of Education;
- Seven CEOs and senior executives of Australian higher education peak groups;
- The Chief Commissioner of Australia's higher education regulator, TEQSA;
- Two former Ministers:

Mr. Jason Clare, in his address, said that this is a high-powered delegation comprising educational policymakers and university administrative stakeholders that shall pave way for collaborative tie-ups with India. "What happens in universities can change the world as the power of education not only changes the lives of individuals but transforms nations. Many Australians who have been educated at the University of Delhi are now making a mark in the world, like Dr Parul Ganju who graduated from India in 2007 with a degree in biochemistry. She is now the founder and CEO of a company developing treatments for people with chronic skin diseases. Last year she was the BioSpectrum Asia Woman Entrepreneur of the Year. That's the power of education. To do good. To transform lives and nations", Clare said.

"Tomorrow, 10 new MOUs will be signed, also tomorrow Minister Pradhan and I will sign an important agreement. The Mechanism for the Mutual Recognition of Qualifications. It locks in the rules for mutual recognition to access education in Australia and India. It delivers immediate benefits for students and higher education institutions in both our countries. It means that an Indian student can be sure that a degree they obtain from an Australian University will be recognised if they want to continue higher education in India or they may be able to study a course structured with stages at an Australian university campus here or another country, and then complete their bachelor's degree in Australia, and be confident their education qualification will be recognised in India." he also said, adding that such educational MoUs between the two countries will pave way for setting up a mechanism for mutual recognition of professionalism too. He also introduced Mr. Gilchrist as someone whose parents understood the importance of education; his parents were teachers and made him complete his graduation from correspondence when he went to play in London.

Mr. Adam Gilchrist stressed on deepening the ties between India and Australia in the field of education. India, through its NEP, he said, can be the ground for future educational strategies and policies of the world. He spoke about how important education and passion are and expressed his excitement about setting a campus in India.

Prof. Yogesh Singh, Vice Chancellor of University of Delhi gave his opening remarks and stressed on the significance of internationalization of education. He emphasized that we shall discuss how to develop a system for equivalence of credits and degrees of both the nations. Prof. C. Sheela Reddy, Principal, Sri Venkateswara College, stressed that National Education Policy 2020, emphasizes practices with diverse educational systems through two way mobility of students and scholars. After the opening remarks, the floor was open for discussion.

One of the delegates shared his experience of their offshore campus at Vietnam, which is one the most successful universities in that country. He emphasized that the purpose of these offshore campuses is not generating money or helping in the ranking but a larger purpose of positive contribution to the society. They have worked towards society building in Vietnam and emphasized on exploring their potential of contributing to the Indian society. He also stressed that Covid 19 pandemic has brought us very close and made us realise that we all are intricately linked. In Australia, they realise the value of migration of skilled workforce.

Professor Poonam Verma expressed the keenness of University of Delhi colleges in collaboration with Australian Universities. She expressed her apprehensions regarding few points; while Australia is a developed nation however India is still struggling with socio economic disparity across various sections of the society and so here at University

of Delhi, many of the students belonging to the economically weaker section of the society might face challenges in making use of this opportunity. She suggested that for the beginning, we can start with a one semester exchange program.

Professor Niranjan Kumar said that the fees structure of Australian Universities is very different; will the same be applicable in India? In response to this Professor Patricia Davidson, Vice Chancellor, University of Wollongong said that the fees structure varies from nation to nation.

One of the Australian delegated shared that though initially it was a challenge for Australian students to go to offshore campuses but the students have said that it's been a life changing and enriching experience.
