REPORT

The session started with Dr. Garima V Arora, Assistant Professor, Department of Mathematics and Criteria 1, NAAC member, Sri Venkateswara College welcoming the resource persons, Prof. Pratyush Vatsala, Principal, Lakshmi Bai College, University of Delhi and Dr. Purna Malhotra, Ram lal Anand College, University of Delhi, Prof. Swarn Singh, IQAC coordinator and Dr. Deepti Jain, Criteria 1 coordinator, Sri Venkateswara College and all the participants.



Prof. Pratyush was felicitated by Prof. Swarn.

Both the speakers were introduced, and were then invited for conducting the session entitled ‘Culture & Communication’ under the Value Addition Courses, to be introduced from the academic year 2022-23, under NEP-2020.

Prof. Pratyush took over by focusing on why having knowledge of our Indian Culture is important. She stressed upon how students have missed the very basic values which is a compass of our lives. These values if learnt and incorporated would help in tackling every situation.

She started the session by reciting a prayer, which is a common practice in our Indian Culture--

Sarve Bhavantu Sukhinah

She recited prayers which meant ‘whatever we have received, we shall give back more’.

She, then explained how culture and man are linked and the approach to have an integrated mind, body and soul, which determinesthe sense of harmony in the thoughts, feelings and actions.

The aim and purpose of education through NEP 2020 was resonated. With ‘Culture & Communication’ as one of the subjects offered under VAC, its learning objectives and outcomes were focussed upon.

The following units are a part of the syllabus:

Unit I talks about the Ethical values from Indian Cultural Heritage.

Unit II is all about learning like skills and having an effective communication.

Stages of Indian culture, viz-a-viz, the Vedic age, the classical age, the medieval age and the modern age were discussed.

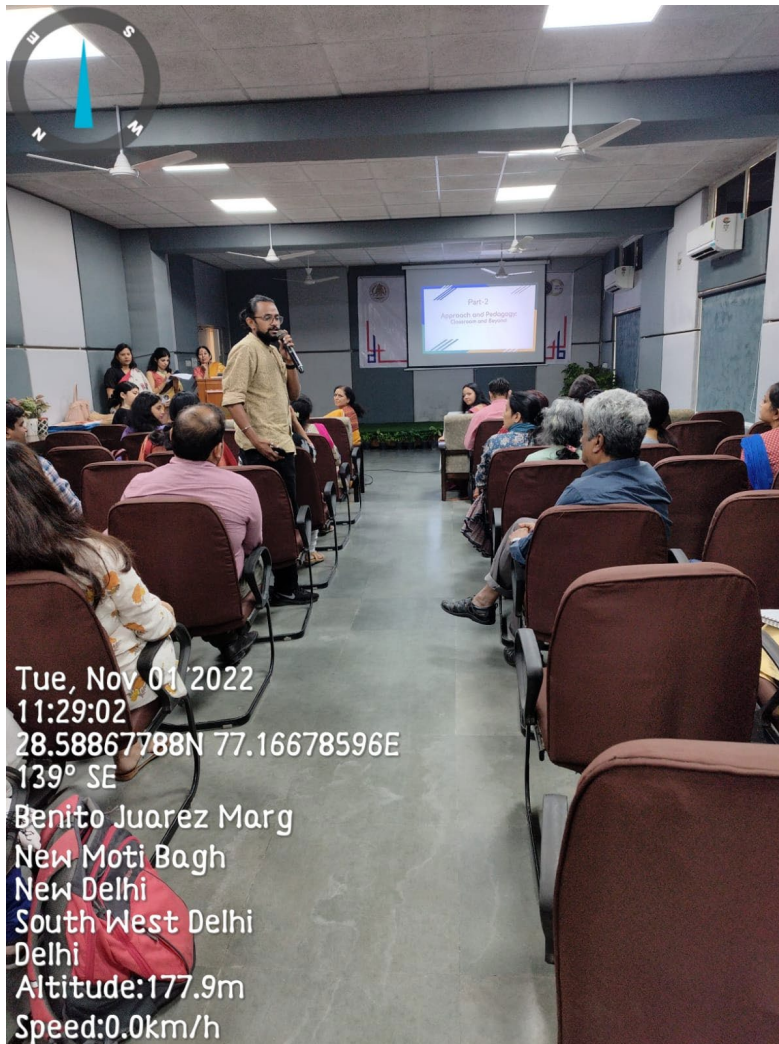
The characteristics of our Indian culture were also discussed, with a mention of Swami Vivekananda and the Shanti Path.



The pedagogy and the practical aspects of the course were then taken up by Dr. Prerna. The overview of the course – its concept and how it is to be implemented was understood. She also reviewed the course objectives and the outcomes from these objectives. The syllabus was again briefed by her and some readings were suggested. The pedagogy for the theory and practical components were suggested. Some class activities were also suggested based on the readings of the three mentioned units in the syllabus.



A round of introduction by the participants was taken up for understanding the diversity of the faculty members. The participants were divided in 3 groups of 12+12+11. They then dispersed for a tea break at 11:30 am.



After the tea break, participants got into their respective groups named as Nalanda, Takshshila and Vikramshila. They were asked to come up with suggestions for the activities that can be conducted in or outside the classroom.



After the group discussion, each groups' representatives shared their ideas with the rest of the participants.



At the end both the speakers gave their concluding remarks and on behalf of the organizing team Dr. Richa Misra, Department of Zoology, Sri Venkateswara College, proposed the vote of thanks, followed by a group photograph.



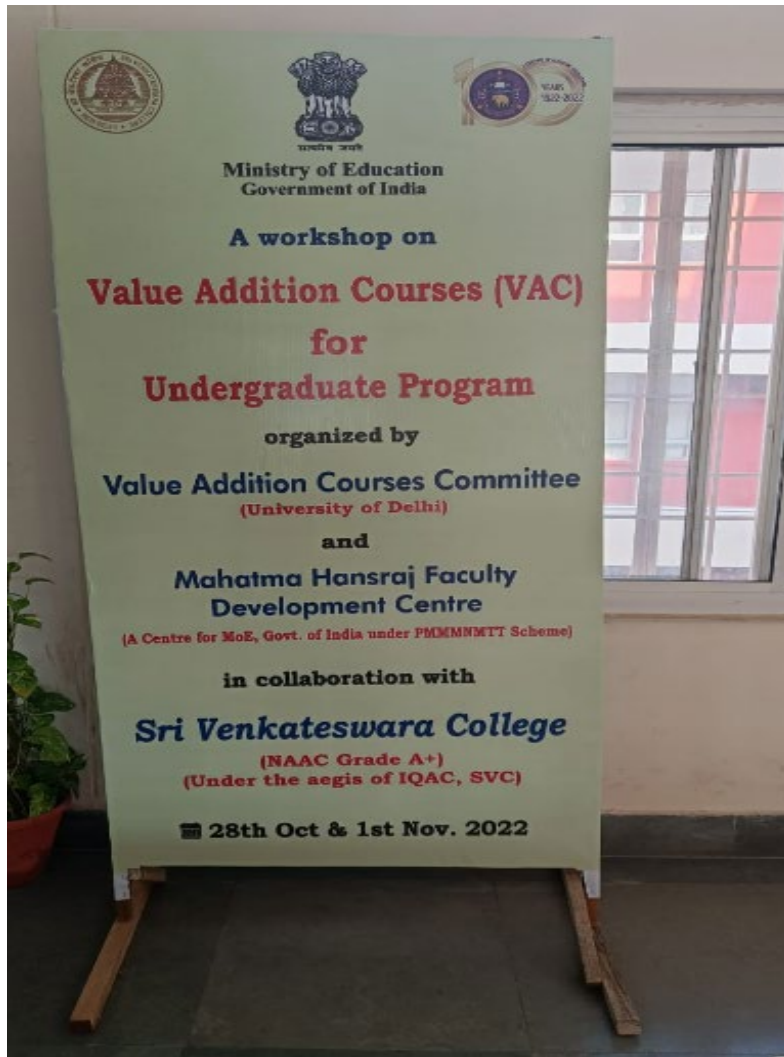
