
- a. Teaching-Learning Process










1.How much of the syllabus was covered in the class? 291 responses




2. How well did the teachers prepare for the classes? 291 responses



3. How well were the teachers able to communicate? 291 responses




4. The teacher's approach to teaching can best be described as ²⁹¹ responses




5. Fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers.




6. Was your performance in assignments discussed with you? 291 responses




7. The institute takes active interest in promoting internship, student exchange, field visitopportunities for students.


8. The teaching and mentoring process in your institution facilitates you in cognitive, social andemotional growth.


9. The institution provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow.




10. Teachers inform you about your expected competencies, course outcomes and programme outcomes.






12. The teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications. ²⁹¹ responses




13. The teachers identify your strengths and encourage you with providing right level of challenges.




14. Teachers are able to identify your weaknesses and help you to overcome them. ²⁹¹ responses




15. The institution makes effort to engage students in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement of the teaching learning process.






