The world is facing inter-related crises from climate change, conflict, inequalities, threats to food security, pandemic disease, pollution and habitat loss. Solutions are often sought through the development and deployment of science and emerging technologies.

This course will take a different perspective and investigate contemporary global crises by considering their impact on human societies and planetary health. We will explore:

- the historic causes of global crises,
- the legacy of the past in the globalised world,
- the nature and extent of contemporary sustainability challenges,
- potential solutions to local & global challenges.

The course is interdisciplinary, taught by historians, heritage professionals and social scientists and includes site visits to explore aspects of the past, present and future of sustainability and the long-term relationship between people and planet.

This course is ideal if you want to understand more about the humanities' distinct approaches to contemporary sustainability issues and the central role that culture plays as both a driver and potential solution to numerous global crises.

Crime Investigations – 10 cps

Taught by ex-police officers this crime investigation course will teach you vital and transferable skills into the world of both law enforcement and wider employment. You will learn how to analyse information and put together a strategy for interviewing a suspect under caution.

This course will provide you with skills that are taught to police officers on initial recruitment and who study on the Professional Policing degree and will be taught by a mixture of policing academics who were serving police officers.

- Pit your wits against ex police officers and detectives as they play your suspect
- Learn to train your mind to remember details for live interactive incidents
- Write a statement as the police would do it
- Learn and understand some basic UK criminal law offences.

This course is ideal for students from all academic disciplines who have an interest in crime and crime investigation and would like an insight into how the police run investigations. You should have the required English language skills.

Cybercrime and Cyber-Security – 10cps

The use of computer technologies is instrumental for everyday life. BUT just as computer technologies, devices and networking have been expanded, cybercrime has expanded too. With increasing activities on the Internet, cybercrime is becoming an important study area.

This criminology course explores the history, nature, and patterns of cybercrime, introducing students to the criminological study of it.

By participating in this course, you will be introduced to:

- How cybercrime is perceived in society, politics, and the media
- The concept of cybercrime and its current and potential impact on a globalised society
- Constantly developing crime areas and the challenges to cybersecurity and online policing.

The course is ideal for university-level students who have an interest in cybercrime and cyber-security and have the required English language skills.

Design and Innovation in Business – 10cps

Get ahead of the competition and stand out from the crowd in today's business world by demonstrating your idea generation and problem-solving skills. You will explore the business case for creativity in the workplace and will work in teams to solve simple design problems, experimenting with new approaches to design thinking.

You will develop a personal project, supported by lectures on marketing, how to launch a new product or service, and practice presentation skills so that, by the final day, you'll have a completed project for your portfolio.

This course is ideal for university-level business and marketing students who wish to explore their creativity by combining techniques from the design and marketing professionals. You should have the required English skills.

This course will take you on a challenging creative journey, from observational drawing, life study and drawing on location to more expressive mark-making techniques and creative approaches.

It aims to enable you to create drawings and collages that demonstrate how you respond to new experiences and the environment around you, and how your time in the UK can be expressed in art. Classroom activities will be complemented with a visit to the Yorkshire Sculpture Park and the Barbara Hepworth Museum, to explore further the themes of drawing, shape, scale and texture in work by British artists.

This course is ideal for undergraduate students from all disciplines and abilities and have the required English language skills.

On this market-oriented course, you will have access to real-time data from our Bloomberg Terminals, and upon completing the required units, you will be awarded the Bloomberg Market Concepts (BMC) certificate. The course provides a practical introduction to the global financial markets as well as an assessment of the common financial asset classes.

During the course you will focus on:

- The analysis of the main financial markets and securities
- The analysis of financial statements
- The management of equity portfolios.

At the end of the course, you will be equipped with the skills required to analyse financial securities and to exploit market opportunities.

This course is ideal for students who have completed at least one year of undergraduate studies in Accounting, Finance or Economics, and have an interest in financial investment analysis.

Financial Mathematics – 10cps

Explore the role of mathematics in modern financial markets!

This course looks at the main topics in financial mathematics and will improve your mathematical understanding of the financial products used in the financial industries.

You will be introduced to a range of basic concepts and assumptions which are central to financial mathematics such as viability, completeness, the arbitrage principle, self-financing and replication.

You will cover applications of geometric series –annuities, sinking funds, mortgage and debt repayments, options – general properties, put/call parity, bounds on option prices, option pricing using the binomial model, the Cox-Ross-Rubinstein form, and the Black-Scholes formula for pricing derivatives.

The course is ideal for business students who want to improve their mathematical understanding, and mathematics students who are considering a career in Finance.

International Fashion Branding and Design – 10cps

Join us to explore fashion design, consumer behaviour and brand development in a UK and international context. The course will provide a link between the creative process of fashion design and an understanding of the fashion industry today.

You will begin the course with an introduction to fashion design in the UK, looking at British designers of global significance such as Paul Smith, Vivienne Westwood and Alexander McQueen, and learn how British fashion brands have created a distinct voice in both the UK and international markets. You will then work on a project where you will research, design and create a new brand identity for a collection of your own fashion garments, accessories or products.

This course is ideal for university-level students who will have completed the first year of a course related to fashion design or fashion marketing, communication, or promotion. You should also have the required English language skills.

Photography and Heritage

This exciting course will get you out and about in Nottingham and teach you the necessary skills to capture the identity of a place and the aesthetic qualities of landmarks in your photographs!

You will devise your own briefs and respond to historic and cultural locations. You will discover a variety of techniques and methods for making photographs including developing and printing in a darkroom, learning how to edit and sequence, and making a short 'zine' of work using InDesign software. At the end of the course you will sequence your photos together to express your personal experience,

This course is ideal for university-level students with a passion for photography and heritage and have the required English language skills.

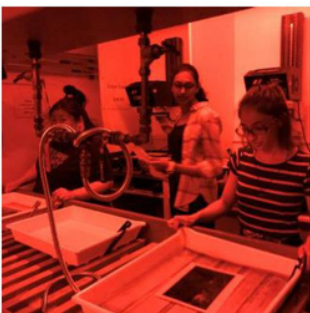

Serious and Organised Crime – 10cps

Serious and Organised Crime (SOC) has become a significant concern and appears to be on the increase globally. Within this module, we explore the motivations, activities and structures surrounding the overarching umbrella of SOC.

Using case studies such as the Japanese Yakuza and Italian Mafia, alongside British examples of Organised Crime to illustrate the links and progression from local to global, we will discuss the structures and hierarchies of Organised Crime Groups (OCGs) as well as some of the more prominent forms of organised crime. This examination extends beyond better known forms of organised crime such as slavery, trafficking of people, products or wildlife, and racketeering, into activities facilitating these illegitimate businesses such as corruption, money laundering, and supportive legitimate enterprises.

The course is multi-disciplinary and would be suitable for students from a range of academic interests such as criminology, law, international relations, sociology and many other disciplines, with an interest in this area, but no prior subject specific learning is required.

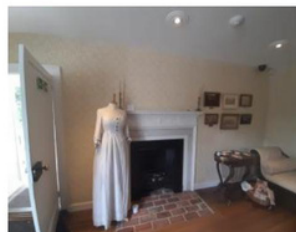
