**STUDENTS UNION ELECTION :: 2016-2017**

1. As per the constitution of the College Students Union, only students **with one year standing in the College** shall be eligible to contest election for the Post of **President** and **Secretary** of the Sri Venkateswara College Students Union.
2. No student shall be eligible to contest and/or hold a post of Office-Bearer for more than one academic year and in case of Central Councillors of DUSU, this period is restricted to two years. Further, no candidate is allowed to contest for more than one post.
3. Should have secured minimum 50% aggregate marks in the previous year (2015-2016) at the Delhi University Annual examinations in I Year/II Year (in case of III Year candidates,- 50% aggregate in both I & II Years combined is required) and it is also essential that subsidiary/concurrent/qualifying Examinations are passed, for contesting Sri Venkateswara College Students Union Elections for the post of President, Vice President, Secretary, Joint Secretary and Class Representatives. However, the above mentioned condition of 50% aggregate marks in the previous year examination is not applicable to the contestants for Central Councillors of DUSU.
4. Candidates contesting for any post in the Sri Venkateswara College Students Union Elections, are not allowed to propose or second the name of any other candidate for the same post.
5. The tenure of the **President, Vice President, Secretary, Joint Secretary and Class Representatives will be for one year.**
6. No Candidate is allowed to propose or second his/her own candidature for any post. No Student/Candidate is allowed to propose or second the names of more than one candidate for the same post.
7. **Only those students who pay their fees by 31<sup>st</sup> August, 2016 upto 2.00 PM** are eligible to vote and file Nominations for the DUSU as well as Sri Venkateswara College Students Union Elections to be held on **09<sup>th</sup> September, 2016.**
8. **Under-Graduate Students between the ages of 17 and 22 as on 16<sup>th</sup> August of that academic year may contest elections.** This age range may be appropriately relaxed in the case of Professional Colleges, where courses often range between 4 and 5 years. **For Post-Graduate Students the maximum age limit to legitimately contest an election would be 24-25 years.**
