CODE OF CONDUCT

Sri Venkateswara College Students Union Election
(As per the Supreme Court Judgement)

CODE OF CONDUCT :- *The students contesting Election for the College Students' Union must strictly adhere to the following guidelines relating to Code of conduct during the Elections :-*

1. The union/representative body so elected shall only comprise of regular students enrolled in a full time course in the College of the University. No candidate or his supporters will indulge in any act of gross indiscipline as stated in Ordinance XV-B as per rules.
2. Under-Graduate Students between the ages of 17 and 22 as on 16th August of that academic year may contest elections. This age range may be appropriately relaxed in the case of Professional Colleges, where courses often range between 4 and 5 years (maximum relaxation of one year for the upper age limit for Professional Colleges). For Post-Graduate students, the maximum age-limit to contest an election would be 25 years as on 16th August on the year of elections. For Research Students the maximum age-limit to legitimately contest an election would be 28 years.
3. The candidate should in no event have any academic arrears in the year of contesting the election. Any pending paper(s) will be construed as academic arrear(s). The candidate should have attained the minimum percentage of attendance as prescribed by the University or 75% attendance, whichever is higher. The candidate shall have one opportunity to contest for the post of Office-Bearer, and two opportunities to contest for the post of an Executive Member. No candidate can contest simultaneously for more than one post.
4. The candidate should not have a previous criminal record, that is to say he/she should not have been tried and/or convicted of any criminal offence or misdemeanor. The candidate shall also not have been subjected to any disciplinary action by the College/University authorities. Further, the contestants should not have failed in the preceding academic year and/or re-admitted in the current year as per university rules.
5. No candidate shall indulge in, nor shall abet, any activity, which may aggravate existing differences or create mutual hatred or cause tension between different castes and communities, religious or linguistic, or between any group(s) of students. Places of worship, within or without the Campus shall not be used for election propaganda.
