

Model United Nations (MUN) is an academic and competitive simulation of the United Nations Organisation (UNO) offering students and budding academics an opportunity to step into the role of diplomats and delegates, represent different countries which hold an important stake in a variety of international issues and not only learn more about these problems and the international system but also offer fresh perspectives and unique solutions to global problems which have manifested themselves in a variety of ways today.

In an international order which grows in complexity every day, with the role of the UN itself coming into question, events like MUNs offer young minds a platform to not only understand the current discourse and institutions but also refine them as they see fit for the future. 



DETAILED REPORT OF THE EVENT:

A registration desk was set up at the college gate for delegate verification. Afterward, both delegates and Executive Board members proceeded to the canteen area for breakfast. The opening ceremony commenced at 9:30 AM. The gathering was addressed by our Principal, Professor K. Chandramani Singh, Dr. S. Krishna Kumar; Dr. Namita Pandey; and Mr. Ashish Kumar Thakur. The conference was officially declared open by the Secretary-General, Mr. Durgesh Jha.

The committees began their respective sessions at 10:30 AM, with all five committees running simultaneously. Delegates engaged in productive discussions and presented solution-oriented arguments. Each committee's co-chairpersons presided over the session, which included General Speakers' Lists, moderated caucuses, unmoderated caucuses, and more. The committees broke for an official lunch at 1:00 PM, after which they resumed discussions with Session 2. On Day 1, the participants dispersed at 5:00 PM. Day 2 began with delegate identity verification at the college gate, followed by breakfast, just as on Day 1. The first committee session started at 9:30 AM. The second day focused on generating solutions for the listed agendas. Committees broke for an official lunch at 1:00 PM, followed by Session 4. The discussions concluded with the submission of an Official Documentation, and the Secretariat held a feedback session with each committee.

The Closing Ceremony commenced at 3:30 PM, during which the results of all the committees were announced, and the winners received awards and cash prizes. The Executive Board and Secretariat members were also felicitated. The event concluded with a vote of thanks from the Deputy Secretary-General, and the Secretary-General officially declared the conference closed."
