





Originally focused on Delhi-NCR, it has since expanded its reach and become a leading milk supplier in the region.

The factory, through 'Operation Flood,' collaborates with farmer groups, buying their milk. This supports farmers financially and promotes organized dairy farming. With 1500 milk booths and 300 Safal outlets, it creates a reliable market for their products. By expanding to various regions and selling 30 lakh litres of milk daily, it boosts agricultural production and contributes to economic growth by providing income opportunities for farmers and fostering a stable dairy industry.

Mother Dairy's supply chain has positive socio-economic dimensions. By sourcing milk from cooperatives and village-level organizations, it supports local farmers, creating income opportunities and fostering community development. The expansion of retail presence through Safal outlets not only provides convenient access to fresh produce but also generates employment at the local level.

Moreover, the supply of milk and milk products to national and international food processing companies contributes to economic growth on a larger scale. This trade enhances income for farmers and promotes the reputation of the region's dairy industry globally.

During the visit, the students observed the rigorous testing processes employed by Mother Dairy to ensure the quality and safety of their products. This includes adherence to standards and regulations, reflecting their commitment to delivering reliable dairy products.

The industrial visit provided a firsthand experience of the practical aspects of production and distribution to the students. They got the opportunity to apply theoretical knowledge to real-world scenarios, gaining valuable insights into the functioning of a large-scale dairy operation.

The visit highlighted the social and economic impact of Mother Dairy, showcasing how it contributes to the dairy industry's development. The company's initiatives under Operation Flood align with broader goals of enhancing rural livelihoods and achieving self-sufficiency in milk production.
