
BRIEF INFORMATION ABOUT THE ACTIVITY

REPORT:


The visit to the National Zoological Park, Delhi, on 17th October 2024, was a highly engaging and enriching experience for the Semester V students of the SEC course on Sustainable Ecotourism and Entrepreneurship. This excursion provided an invaluable opportunity to observe wildlife and understand the intricate balance between conservation and ecotourism, which lies at the heart of sustainable practices. The park, known for its diverse fauna and carefully maintained enclosures, offered students a firsthand look at a wide variety of species. Among the highlights were the powerful rhinoceros, a symbol of strength and resilience, and the graceful white tiger, whose rare beauty left a lasting impression. The leopard, with its stealth and agility, captured the students' fascination, while the spotted hyenas demonstrated intriguing behaviours that sparked discussions about their ecological role. The deer, in their various species, were a delight to watch, embodying the elegance and calm of nature. The sight of vibrant peacocks added a touch of vivid beauty, and their calls echoed through the park, creating an atmosphere of enchantment. The reptile house, home to a variety of snakes, was particularly engaging for students interested in the conservation of less-appreciated species. Observing these reptiles up close encouraged a discussion about their importance in maintaining ecological balance and the challenges they face due to habitat destruction and misconceptions. The students were also intrigued by the larger carnivores, such as the white tiger and hyena, whose conservation requires specialized knowledge and resources.

The educational aspect of the visit extended beyond observing animals. Students were encouraged to critically evaluate the design and maintenance of the enclosures, noting how the habitats replicated natural environments. These observations aligned with their course objectives, as they analyzed the integration of sustainability into the zoo's management practices. The eco-friendly initiatives within the zoo, such as waste segregation, limited use of plastics, and water recycling measures, highlighted the efforts to minimize the environmental footprint of such an establishment. This served as a practical example of how institutions can balance ecological integrity with visitor engagement. Additionally, the students reflected on the role of zoos in biodiversity conservation. They discussed how these spaces act as sanctuaries for endangered species, centers for public education, and platforms for research and breeding programs. The visit also sparked conversations about the ethical dimensions of wildlife tourism and how these facilities can be improved to enhance animal welfare while educating visitors about the importance of preservation. This activity allowed students to combine their learning with documentation, creating a repository of visual data for future reference. These photographs will

enable a deeper analysis of the visit and can be incorporated into their assignments and projects related to ecotourism and sustainability. The visit concluded with a collective sense of appreciation for the richness of biodiversity and the critical need for sustainable practices in wildlife conservation and tourism. It was an experience that blended learning with a deep sense of connection to nature, fostering a greater understanding of the principles of ecotourism. This field trip was not only educational but also inspiring, leaving the students with a stronger awareness of their role in promoting sustainability. The observations and reflections from this visit will undoubtedly enrich their academic journey and equip them with practical insights for future endeavours in sustainable entrepreneurship.
