BRIEF INFORMATION ABOUT THE ACTIVITY

TOPIC/SUBJECT OF THE ACTIVITY	Swachhta Pakhwada 2024, Swachhta Pledge
OBJECTIVES	The institution aimed to support the National purpose of Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, introduced by Honorable Prime Minister Narendra Modi and instill in its pupils a feeling of social responsibility towards their environment by organising the Swachhta Pledge programme.
METHODOLOGY	The program started with welcome speech by College Principal Prof. V Ravi, who emphasized pivotal role of cleanliness in general well being. He exhorted everyone to make cleanliness a way of life and described how modest individual actions might have a big group effect. This was followed by speech of Vice Principal, Professor K.C. Singh, in which he discussed Mahatma Gandhi's ideas on sanitation and hygiene and how they relate to the current issues of waste management and sustainable development. He also urged everyone to go outside the university and make a difference in establishing clean environments in their communities. This was followed by program's major feature, the principal and faculty members led the recitation of the Swachhta Pledge. The whole campus community rose together and reaffirmed the vow to maintain cleanliness and

	inculcate healthy and environment-friendly habits in day-to-day activities. The institution also put up a Swachhta Banner in the entryway to further encourage environmental responsibility and cleanliness. Blank space was provided beneath for participants to submit their opinions.
OUTCOMES	The program was a part of the college's continuous efforts to engage the community in meaningful discourse about cleanliness. Students also composed statements highlighting the need of a clean environment for health, the necessity of cutting trash, and the responsibility of each citizen to maintain public areas neat. In addition, students are more engaged in discussions about sustainable practices on campus.

Swachh Bharat Abhiyan was introduced by Honorable Prime Minister Narendra Modi on October 2, 2014, with the goal of eradicating open defecation and fostering cleanliness in public areas across the country. Every citizen is included in this purpose, which emphasizes individual accountability for maintaining a clean environment. The Swachhta Pledge calls on people to make a commitment to personal hygiene and community engagement in upholding sanitation and hygiene standards. The institution aimed to support this national purpose and instill in its pupils a feeling of social responsibility towards their environment by organising the Swachhta Pledge programme.

Sri Venkateswara College Swachhta Pledge program was a historic occasion that personified the values of cleanliness, harmony, and engaged citizenry. The occasion was a component of the wider Swachh Bharat Abhiyan (Clean India Mission), which was started by the Indian government to encourage cleanliness throughout the country. Teachers, students, and non-teaching staff were encouraged to participate in the Swachhta Pledge initiative in order to help create a cleaner, healthier, and more sustainable environment. The academic and administrative communities of the institution enthusiastically participated in the initiative, taking the Swachhta Pledge and joining forces for a variety of cleanliness campaigns, informative lectures, and cooperative activities.

At 10:30 AM, the Swachhta Pledge program got underway with a welcoming speech from college principal Prof. V. Ravi. Our Principal underlined the value of cleanliness as a strategy to improve people's general well-being and visual appeal in addition to preventing illness. He exhorted educators and learners to make cleanliness a way of life and described how modest individual actions might have a big group effect.

Following the welcoming speech, our Vice Principal, Professor K.C. Singh, delivered a motivational lecture on the importance of the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan in modern India. In his speech, he discussed Mahatma Gandhi's ideas on sanitation and hygiene and how they relate to the current issues of waste management and sustainable development. He urged everyone to go outside the university and make a difference in establishing clean environments in their communities and public areas.

The principal and faculty members led the recitation of the Swachhta Pledge, which was the program's major feature. The whole campus community rose together and reaffirmed the vow with fervor and resolve. The commitment placed a strong emphasis on the necessity of individual and group accountability for maintaining clean public areas, utilizing trash cans, refraining from littering, and maintaining good hygiene in day-to-day activities.

Displaying a Swachhta Banner in the College Foyer: A Platform for Voices on Cleanliness

Our institution put up a Swachhta Banner in the entryway to further encourage environmental responsibility and cleanliness. A sizable blank space has been provided beneath the Swacchta images for participants to submit their opinions, ideas, and recommendations for environmental preservation and hygiene. Students, teachers, and staff may share their opinions about the value of sustainability, hygiene, and cleanliness with this interactive banner. The program is a part of the college's continuous efforts to make sure that everyone feels included in the Swachh Bharat goal and to engage the community in meaningful discourse about these important topics.

Nearby are markers that invite everyone passing through the foyer to pause for a minute and make a contribution. The response to the banner has been tremendous over the last two days. Students have composed statements highlighting the need of a clean environment for health, the necessity of cutting trash, and the responsibility of each citizen to maintain public areas neat. A few people have disclosed their personal resolve to reduce their use of plastic, separate their garbage, and practice good hygiene in public and private areas.

Educators have also added inspirational sayings and guidance to the banner, such as "A clean environment leads to a clear mind" and "Our responsibility towards cleanliness does not end at home; it extends to the world outside." Students are having more discussions about sustainable practices on campus as a result of their efforts. The banner has evolved into both a potent reminder that change starts with individual action and a symbol of cleanliness awareness.

All things considered, the campus community now feels more accountable and owns more. It has also brought attention to the necessity of ongoing efforts to maintain a clean and green environment around us. The Swachhta Banner will be hanging in the foyer for a month, and to keep the momentum of this campaign going, there will be recurring clean-up drives and other events. It is evidence of our community's will to work together to create a more hygienic and safe environment for all.
