Report

The session by Ms. Seema Sahay focused on key aspects of non-verbal communication, including the elevator syndrome, proxemics, glossophobia, and the role of body language in effective communication.

She began by discussing the elevator syndrome, a phenomenon where people tend to avoid interaction and maintain rigid body language in confined spaces, such as elevators. This behavior highlights the importance of understanding proxemics, which refers to the study of personal space. Ms. Sahay elaborated on its various types—intimate, personal, social, and public spaces—and explained how these concepts are particularly useful in today's globalised world, where individuals interact with people from diverse races and nationalities.


Another crucial topic covered was glossophobia, or the fear of public speaking. She emphasized how an awareness of proxemics can help speakers become more effective. Great orators, she noted, generally take up more space while speaking, which naturally enhances their confidence and authority.

Ms. Sahay also highlighted the importance of power poses, explaining how one's posture plays a significant role in projecting confidence. She further stressed the significance of eye contact in communication. There are two types of gazes—social gaze and power gaze—with the latter being a way to exert confidence and authority.

In the context of interviews, she discussed whether or not one should maintain eye contact. She explained that steady eye contact conveys honesty and sincerity, making a positive impression on the interviewer.

Another key takeaway from the session was that non-verbal intelligence often dominates verbal communication. Ms. Sahay advised that words should always align with body language to ensure effective communication. Certain gestures, such as sitting with arms crossed or maintaining poor posture, should be avoided as they may create a negative impression. Additionally, she cautioned against looking down while answering questions. Instead, candidates should make eye contact with all panelists and use appropriate hand gestures. She also emphasised that hand gestures should be grounded to appear more composed and confident.

Lastly, she highlighted the importance of being well-groomed, as appearance also plays a vital role in creating a strong first impression.






Image 1: Speaker introducing the students to the concept of Proxemics

1. Course Wise Analysis




2. Year Wise Analysis





