## **Event Summary:**

Akhil Bhartiya Netrahin Sangh (ABNS) is a school in New Delhi, dedicated to the holistic development of vision-impaired students. It is located in B-3 block, Baba Ramdev Marg, Raghbir Nagar, New Delhi, 110027, with school timings from 8 am to 2 pm, including a lunch break from 12 noon to 1 pm.

The event showcased the talents of vision-impaired students with handmade artifacts, candles, and more on display at the school entrance. The students gather in the canteen mess for lunch, beginning with a prayer to express gratitude.

Inside the school, there is a separate unit where students create candles and dhoopbatti for Diwali. They use software like JAWS and NVD to operate computers.

Students interested in computer skills can access the computer lab even after school hours, up to 4 pm, albeit without a trainer. A shop at the entrance offers products such as candles, incense sticks, agarbatti, and light bulbs.

ABNS not only focuses on academics but also the holistic development of students, providing facilities like a music room equipped with instruments and a television. The school has a diverse student population from different states.

There is an on-campus hostel for students, and the school has a large open ground at its center, surrounded by classrooms. The three-floor facility comprises the ground floor for academic studies, the first floor for the hostel, and the second floor under construction.

Notably, the teachers at ABNS are compassionate and many are themselves vision-impaired, fostering a supportive learning environment for all students.

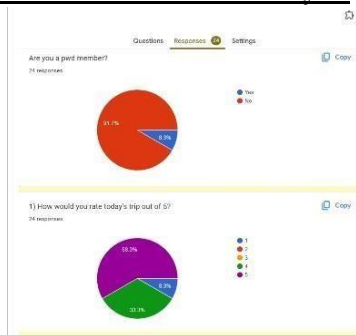
