On the second day, Lahar transformed into a sports extravaganza featuring the groundbreaking debut of blind cricket, a highlight that added a unique and memorable dimension to the event, creating joy and excitement among participants and spectators alike.

EVENT SUMMARY:

It was a truly remarkable experience to witness how young minds put forward their vision on various sensitive issues and incidents by their eloquent word selection.

Everyone is born with a unique talent, this statement is well proved by the PWDs who showcased their talent be it their mimicry, flexibility or mesmerizing dancing, in the 'Kaushal'- talent hunt. They had left no stone unturned to surprise our audience by their fantastic performances.

Lastly, the most awaited event of the day – 'Talash' – the treasure hunt kicked off with utmost zeal. For this competition, there were 30 teams of three members each. First round started, groups were divided and tasks assigned. It was riveting to see how hastily the teams were collecting the items.

After the first round, the top 10 teams were selected to proceed to the final round. This round consisted of collecting cards according to the hints provided. All teams used their intelligence to the fullest, making the event highly competitive and engaging.

Matches were played with modified rules to accommodate the diverse abilities of the players, emphasizing fair play and sportsmanship above all else. The match was officiated by EOC volunteers who ensured that the spirit of the game was upheld throughout. After intense rounds of competition, we got our winners, marking the culmination of an unforgettable cricket event filled with camaraderie and excitement.

Next, we had the-Three-legged race where the college ground was buzzed with excitement as students gathered for the highly anticipated event which witnessed enthusiastic participation from 30 individuals, forming a total of 15 pairs where each pair composed of a Persons with Disability (PWD) and a non-PWD student who competed with one leg tied to their partner's. The event, aimed at fostering teamwork and inclusivity, saw spirited participation from students across the campus. Amid cheers and encouragement, teams battled it out in the initial rounds, displaying impressive coordination and determination. After four rounds of spirited racing, the top three teams emerged triumphant, and their exceptional performance earned them recognition and applause from fellow participants and spectators alike.

As the tension mounted, the focus shifted to the next challenge - a test of force, power, and endurance: tug of war bringing together a total of 40 participants divided into 8 diverse teams. Each team was a mix of PWD and non-PWD students engaged in exhilarating matches, showcasing strength and camaraderie. However, the excitement didn't end there. The climax of the event was the thrilling paper fold dance competition. Paired teams mesmerized the audience with their creativity and agility as they danced on a single piece of paper, folding it after every round without letting it touch the ground. The atmosphere crackled with energy as participants showcased their talent and innovation, leaving the judges facing a tough decision in selecting a winner.

After a delightful lunch in the hostel mess, the prize distribution ceremony commenced with the esteemed presence of the chief guest and guest of honour Dr Satyapal Singh who expressed gratitude towards EOC and SVC for inviting him into the delightful event. 
