





5. Event Report

Global Youth's first Chat with a Diplomat (CWAD) for the session was held at Sri Venkateswara College with Ms Mihoko NAGAI, First Secretary, Embassy of Japan as the speaker. The event explored the prospective ways that India and Japan can explore strengthening bilateral cooperation in areas such as resource efficiency, low-carbon technology and green hydrogen She talked about the various potential Avenues on which India and Japan could collaborate in the better interest of the society and We discussed the prospective ways that India and Japan can explore to strengthen bilateral cooperation in areas such as resource efficiency, low-carbon technology, and green hydrogen.

Her illuminating address was followed by a series of questions in which academicians tried to ponder various grounds of bilateral cooperation like Climate Change mitigation, potential collaborative measures to solve the crises like global semiconductor shortages, etc. Broadly the overall theme of the discussion was centred around how India and Japan are committed to working together to promote peace, stability and prosperity, through economic growth and development in the Indo-Pacific, including Africa, by enhancing connectivity through quality infrastructure and capacity building of their partners. To tap into the synergies between India's target to become carbon neutral by 2050, Japan aims to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by 46% by 2030 which in fact showcases the shared common ideals of India and Japan on the theme of clean energy and climate action. Both nations recognise the pivotal role clean energy has come to assume in the quest for sustainable economic development. Given their parallel ambitions, the two nations harbour the immense potential to collaborate on the issue of climate action. To this effect, the two nations have undertaken multiple joint projects. Among the most prominent of these is the India-Japan Clean Partnership. Both nations share the view that there is no single pathway to achieve a low-carbon economy, but rather there are different paths for each country. In this regard, this Partnership will serve as a basis for the cooperation between the two countries. Japan plans to establish a full-scale international hydrogen supply chain to cut the cost of hydrogen by 2030 and to encourage the use of ammonia in thermal power generation as a low-carbon transition fuel.

India and Japan can further their cooperation in the areas of Electric Vehicles (EV), storage systems including batteries, electric vehicle charging infrastructure (EVCI), and renewable energy like wind, solar, etc. Both Japan and India, as the third and the seventh largest economies respectively, recognised that having access to reliable, clean and economical energy is critical for their economic growth, and appreciated the relevance of grid stability given the high penetration of variable renewable energy. Both countries have agreed to initiate the discussion towards the development of EVs by collaborating with "Policy dialogue on next generation/Zero emission vehicles".

The event turned out to be a huge success with academicians joining in a generous capacity, and both our guests and the Audience expressed great pleasure after attending the event.
