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




learning at the institution becomes an enjoyable and enriching experience that helps you flourish and thrive.



INCUBATION AND RESEARCH CENTRE

Incubation & Research Centre (I&RC) was set up in the Durgabai Deshmukh Block to promote a research-oriented ecosystem in college. The I&RC became operational in June 2023 and provides the following facilities for the faculty members:

- 18 workstations equipped with desktop computers & large-size monitors with high-speed internet.

Sri Venkateswara College believes in inclusivity and diversity. Our college is a differently abled friendly campus with ramps, rails and special toilets. The well-being of all its students' is a priority in the college.

MEDICAL ROOM AND COUNSELING

SVC has a medical room with a full-time medical in-charge and a trained staff to take care of medical emergencies in the college. Since mental health is an equally important aspect of holistic well-being, we have a college counselor who is available to all the students and faculty for one-to-one sessions.

BANKING FACILITY

The South Campus branch of Union Bank of India is situated within the college premises with a working ATM.

PHOTOCOPYING, PRINTING, AND STATIONERY

Photocopying, scanning, and printing services are available on the campus on payment.



BIOINFORMATICS CENTER

The center was established in the year 2006 with an objective to promote Biology, teaching through Bioinformatics, with initial funding from the Department of Biotechnology (DBT) under the Biotechnology Information System (BTISnet) program. The BIC caters to the computational and bioinformatics needs of the undergraduate students, research scholars and teaching staff members from various departments of the college.

ICT FACILITY

The entire campus is Wi-Fi enabled. SVC has its own active directory domain server for Wi-Fi security and network security and provides every student, faculty and staff with their unique ID. Our internet resource lab has 80 systems, and we have three computer labs with 130 systems for student's use.

CAFETERIA

The college canteen is an epicenter of all student activities and discussions. A variety of delicious and healthy snacks are available here. It is especially know for its Masala dosa, Idli and Uttapum. The canteen is a relaxed space for intellectual debates or free-spirited conversations. The College has also recently inaugurated a snack station, aptly named the 'Maggie Point', which offers light refreshments like noodles, sandwiches and cold coffee.



LIBRARY

Sri Venkateswara College Library is a vibrant hub of learning, dedicated to faculty academic excellence, fostering a culture of inquiry, and promoting lifelong learning among our student and faculty. In the past academic year, it has continued to evolve and adapt to meet the diverse needs of our student and faculty.

The library has recently undergone renovation and is completely revamped for a better reader experience. The SVC library has created an inclusive environment that ensures all patrons, regardless of their abilities, can fully participate in and benefit from the library's resources. Dedicated Reading rooms, Braille books, Braille slate and stylus. E-books from DULS are available in the facility.

Each student who joins the department by default becomes a member of the association it has. For instance, anyone taking a B.A. (Hons) in English becomes a member of the English Literary Association.


HOSTEL

The on-campus residential facility is available for full time outstation undergraduate students of the college. Students from nearby areas like NCR-Delhi, Ghaziabad, Greater Noida, Faridabad, Gurugram etc are not eligible for accommodation in the hostels.

Students seeking admission in the hostel must fill the hostel admission form available on the college website. The hostels are the live wire of the campus life. 

SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

Solar Power-Based Electricity



One of the most significant solid wastes is leaf litter and kitchen waste (canteen and hostel mess). These organic wastes are being recycled by adopting vermicomposting for leaf litter and microbial composting for kitchen waste.

The nutritional requirements of our plants are fulfilled by the vermicomposting of the waste generated in our own garden. We refrain from using any chemical based fertiliser. Through this practice, the college ensures that its plants thrive and flourish without the need for chemical-based fertilizers, emphasizing its commitment to eco-friendly and sustainable agricultural practices.

Eco Club



FREESHIP AND STUDENTS AID

The Freeship and Students Aid Committee aims to provide financial assistance to deserving students in the form of partial reimbursement of fees paid by the students pursuing undergraduate or post graduate degree course from the college. The process includes inviting online applications from the students followed by a rigorous verification process by a duly constituted Staff Council Committee. The College provides freeships to all deserving students on the basis of their financial situation, academic performance, regularity, socio-economic status and other relevant factors. During 2023-24 the committee provided freeships to 391 students. An amount of Rs.1965866 was reimbursed from the Student Aid Fund to a group of 391 students from among the students belonging to the economically and socially weaker sections through the Freeship Committee.



FEE REFUND POLICY 2024-25

The University Grants Commission has considered the matter in its 580th meeting held on 15th May 2024, and after considering the relevant factors decided, the following fee refund policy for the academic session 2024-25 vide D.O. No.F.2-71/2022 (CPP-II) (C-114546) dated 12th June, 2024.

- Notwithstanding anything contained in any guidelines/ prospectus/ notification/schedule, a full refund of fees shall be made by the HEIs on account of all cancellations of admissions/migrations of students up to 30 September 2024 and with a deduction of not more than Rs. 1,000, as a processing fee, up to 31 October 2024.
- For any admission schedule extending commencing beyond/after 31 October 2024, the provisions contained in the UGC Notification issued in October 2018 on Refund of Fees and Non-Retention of Original Certificates shall apply (reproduced in the table for ready reference):
- It may also be noted that the UGC has notified the Redressal of Grievances of Students Regulations, 2023 wherein "delay in, or denial of the refund of fees due to a student who withdraws admission within the time mentioned in the University Schedule, subject to guidelines, if any, issued by the Commission from time to time" has been defined as one of the grievances.

Note:-

- By the end of every third month the resident has to pay another 3 months of mess advance at the same rate along with the excess on actual Mess charges of the previous 3 months, otherwise the mess facilities of the residents will be withdrawn.
- Fee is subject to change as per the decision of the College Governing Body.
- Hostel Security amount will be refundable only after the room has been vacated. Hostel Mess Security and Caution money are refundable through cheque only. Application has to be made on a prescribed form along with the photocopy of the room vacation slip and submitted to the hostel office .Security Money has to be claimed within one year after leaving the hostel, beyond which the same lapse to the Hostel Account.
- In case of withdrawal, annual charges will not be refunded. However, monthly room charges will be realized only up to the month in which withdrawal is sought. It is calculated from the date of the written application's submission to the Warden for the withdrawal of admission.
- Hostel charges are subject to revision from time to time.
- In case a student after being admitted wants to get his/her admission cancelled, he/she will be entitled to refund of fees as per hostel/ college rules.

DISCIPLINE 2024-2025

SVC has a reputation for being one of the best disciplined colleges in Delhi University. While our students enjoy a vibrant community life, they are also aware of the importance of discipline and good conduct. College has a robust security system. The entire campus is under CCTV coverage.

ENSURING DISCIPLINE

- Misconduct or misbehaviour of any kind at the time of election to the students' body.
- Misconduct or misbehaviour of any kind, towards a teacher or an employee of the college/University or another institution or any member of statutory body or the University or any visitor to the College, University or another institution.
- Causing damage to furniture or any other property of the college or any institution of the University.
- Lewd, disrespectful behaviour towards women.
- Misconduct, both inside and outside the college campus, is considered unbecoming of a student of this college.
- Making noise in the corridors and the library which are designated silence zone.
- Littering.
- Smoking, alcohol consumption, drug abuse. Inciting others to do any of the acts aforesaid. Smoke-free Zone-Delhi University is partnering with Delhi Police and the World Foundation-South Asia in promoting a tobacco-free environment. As a step in this direction, smoking is banned in our College.
- Use of mobile phones inside the classrooms.
- Ragging in any form.
- Non-return of library book(s) for more than the stipulated time
- The Principal of the College has the ultimate authority to take action for any breach of conduct.
