ABOUT TTD TRUST



Tirumala Tirupati Devasthanams (TTD) is an autonomous government trust under the Government of Andhra Pradesh, responsible for the administration of the renowned Venkateswara Temple in Tirumala—one of the wealthiest and most visited pilgrimage centers globally. Established in 1932 under the TTD Act, the trust initially comprised a seven-member committee and a government-appointed commissioner. The Andhra Pradesh Charitable and Hindu Religious Institutions and Endowments Act of 1969 later expanded its structure and responsibilities, including promoting Indian languages and Hindu Dharma through research and literature. Headquartered in Tirupati and employing around 16,000 personnel, TTD not only manages temple operations but also engages in significant social, religious, literary, and educational initiatives. It offers various services to pilgrims, including transportation, accommodation, free meals, queue management, tonsure facilities, laddu distribution, and widespread ticketing and information centers.

To further advance Sanātana Dharma, TTD established the Srivani Trust in 2019. This initiative aims to construct temples in Scheduled Caste (SC), Scheduled Tribe (ST), and Backward Class (BC) communities, restore heritage temples, and support underfunded temples through the Dhupa-Deepa-Naivedyam Scheme. As of January 2023, TTD had facilitated the construction of 2,068 temples across Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry, and Karnataka.

The Department of Biochemistry at Sri Venkateswara College, University of Delhi, was established in the year 1989. The undergraduate program, a brainchild of Padma Vibhushan Late Prof. B. K. Bachhawat, was started to groom the scientific inquisitiveness in young students. His vision and the invaluable efforts of our former principal, Dr. V. Krishna Moorthy, have consolidated the roots of the department. In 2015, the Department completed its journey of 25 years. Even today, the parent Biochemistry Department, UDSC continues to inspire and support the department.

The objective of the undergraduate course in Biochemistry is to develop a scientific aptitude in the students and to motivate them for research in Life Sciences. The programme offers rigorous training that equips students with a strong foundation in the fundamentals of the subject, along with an understanding of recent developments in Biochemistry and Biotechnology. Through hands-on experience, students gain expertise in advanced biochemical techniques & develop an appreciation for the applications of basic science in biotechnology & modern medicine.

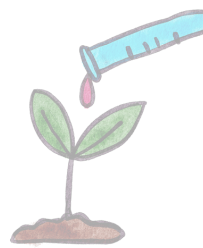
DEPARTMENT OF BOTANY

DEPARTMENT OF CHEMISTRY

The Department of Chemistry is associated with the teaching of chemistry to the students of all science streams of the college, ever since the college started the science stream in 1973-1974, initially for B.Sc. (G) Gr. B with additional Physics and subsidiary chemistry for B.Sc.(H) Botany, Zoology, Stats, and Maths. The department was given an opportunity to start B.Sc. (H) Chemistry with a capacity of 40 students during 1983-1984 and then B.Sc. (H) Bio-Chemistry with a capacity of 25 students during 1989-1990. In addition to its core courses, the department also offers Chemistry as a Generic Elective paper to students from various other disciplines. The department is well equipped with 4 Chemistry laboratories, an Instrumentation Lab, & 3 Research Labs.

It also has a departmental library with a regularly updated collection of books covering various areas of The academic performance of Chemistry students has consistently been outstanding over the past 35 years. More than 95% of B.Sc. (Hons) Chemistry students have secured first divisions, with many earning top ranks and positions at the university level year after year. Alumni feedback has been highly encouraging, reflecting the department's strong academic foundation and mentorship. Graduates have gone on to excel in diverse fields such as information technology, environmental sciences, biotechnology, civil services, management, and scientific research.

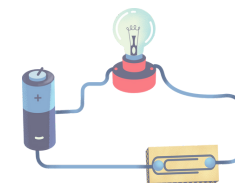

DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE

The Department of Environmental Sciences is a newly constituted department at Sri Venkateswara College, University of Delhi. The Department was established to teach one semester interdisciplinary compulsory course on Environmental Studies after the University of Delhi's mandate in 2014-15. After the introduction of the Choice-Based Credit System in 2015-16, this paper became a four-credit AECC (Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course) for students. Students enrolled at the University are required to study and appear for this paper either in the first or second semester of their academic year. After NEP 2020, the course was renamed as AEC, and now it runs for two semesters (Sem 1/3 or Sem 2/4) for all students. The Environmental Studies course at Sri Venkateswara College (SVC) aims to provide students with the extent of understanding environmental issues.

It is done through integrated, problem-oriented study with fieldwork. It is an interdisciplinary compulsory course with an objective to create environmental awareness among students of all disciplines. Sri Venkateswara college faculties with wide-ranging expertise and background in the subject teach the course. The department is also currently offering minor degree in Environmental Studies and also mentors master's student dissertation. The Department of Environmental Studies develops interest among students in a number of areas, including ecology; biodiversity; conservation; pollution; waste management; and issues of global climate change.

The department is associated with many field experts who have contributed significantly to the field. Students are also offered internship opportunities within the department, and the department also promotes field-based research, participation in conferences, workshops, and seminars. Currently, the department has also been running an add-on course in Herpetology (Herpetology: A Model for Wildlife Conservation).

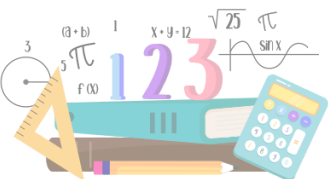
DEPARTMENT OF MATHEMATICS

The Department of Mathematics at Sri Venkateswara College, University of Delhi, was established in the year 1961 with only one teacher, Dr. K. Nageshwar Rao. Mathematics was then offered as a subject in the B.A. Programme only. Dr. Rao left the college in 1969, passing the baton to Mr. L. R. Gaur. Thereafter, Dr. Purnima Gupta joined the department in the year 1972. It was in 1977, under the leadership of the then principal Dr. V. Krishna Murthy and with the collective efforts of Mr. L. R. Gaur and Dr. Purnima Gupta, that the Department introduced the B.A. /B.Sc. (Hons.) Mathematics Program, which is now offered only as B.Sc. (Hons.).

This necessitated the expansion of the Department, which now boasts a rich and distinguished faculty of 17 members. The four-year Honours programme in Mathematics at Sri Venkateswara College is one of the most sought-after courses in the University of Delhi. The well-structured programme empowers the student with the skills and knowledge leading to enhanced career opportunities in industry, commerce, education, finance and research. Ex-faculty: Dr. K. DEPARTMENT OF PHYSICS

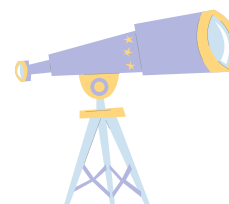
The Department of Physics in Sri Venkateswara College was established in 1973 with just two teachers Dr. Surya Prakash Tewari and Dr. V. Brahmaji Rao, one senior lab assistant Mr. S. V. Ramana Murty and one attendant Mr. Sunder Singh. The department was set up essentially to teach additional physics in the B.Sc. General Group B course. In 1984 the college started the B.Sc. (General) Group A with Electronics specialization course which was to be mainly run by the department of physics.

The enormous success of this course led to the introduction of the B.Sc. (Honours) Electronics course in 1987, and the physics department, which had to run this course, was quite aptly renamed by the college as the Department of Physics & Electronics. With the initiation of this course, the department acquired high-quality experimental apparatus and highly sensitive testing and measuring devices.

All this was accomplished by the department with the pioneering efforts of the then Principal of the college, Dr. V. Krishnamoorthy. The B.Sc. (Honours) physics course came into existence in the college in 1992. The gradual growth of the department soon gave rise to the formation of a separate department called the Physics department to cater exclusively to physics students.

Besides well-equipped laboratories for the undergraduate courses, the Physics department also has research laboratories with state-of-the-art equipment, including Nabertherm Muffle Furnace, Retsch Planetary ball mill, Wayne Kerr Impedance Analyzer, P-E loop tracer, Piezoelectric Poling unit, Thermofisher-Harshaw TLD reader. The much needed impetus to develop such a research infrastructure was provided by the then Principal Padmashree A. Sankara Reddy whose great motivation resulted in getting two major research projects on experimental physics by the department in 2008. Since then 8 major research projects have been awarded to the department by various funding agencies such as UGC, SERB, DST and IUAC. Today a healthy research environment exists in the department where Ph.D students registered in the Department of Physics and Astrophysics, University of Delhi, with our teachers as supervisors, as well as the undergraduate students of the college actively undertake their research work.

DEPARTMENT OF ZOOLOGY

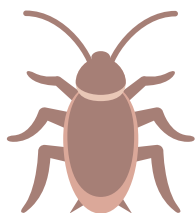
The Department of Zoology at Sri Venkateswara College started with the inauguration of the Science Block in 1973-74 to teach B.Sc (General) B Group with just two teaching faculty, Dr. R. C. Saxena and Dr. E. Vijayan, and eighty students. Soon after, the B.Sc. (Hons.) The Zoology program started in 1974 and went on to become one of the most sought-after departments to study Zoology at an undergraduate level. At present, the department offers two courses: B. Sc. (Hons.) Zoology, M.Sc. Zoology. Moreover, the department also participates in the teaching of B. Sc Life Sciences and B. Sc (Hons.) Biological Sciences. Other than teaching the students of these courses, the department offers various Generic Elective (GE) courses for students of other departments as mandated by the NEP framework. Papers like Insect Vector & Diseases, Human Physiology, Food, Nutrition & Health, Lifestyle Disorders, Economic Zoology, Public Health and Epidemiology, and Model Organisms in Research are very popular among the students. The department also offers various Discipline Selective Elective Courses (DSE's) like Wildlife Conservation and Management, Integrative Systems Biology and Bioinformatics,

Reproductive Biology and Assistive Reproductive Technology, Ethology, Fish and Fisheries, Parasitology, which can be opted by students of any discipline as their GE. The Department has well-equipped laboratories, a state-of-the-art museum, departmental library with a good collection of books, which supplements the college library. The department has two advanced research laboratories (Animal-Plant interactions lab and Fish immunology lab), where students can enroll for Ph.D. degrees, Master's dissertations, and Undergraduate internships. The dynamic faculty with diverse specializations and interests work hard to not only impart knowledge but also to inculcate scientific culture among students. In order to cater to the bright students who take admission in our courses, the faculty are eager to learn at every stage and enhance their research acumen and academic skills through regular training programs. Students are encouraged to participate in internships and trainings, conferences, poster presentations, as well as given opportunities to publish research articles and book chapters.

By adopting the blended teaching learning approach, a major focus is given on the active learning strategies, such as group discussions, subject/paper presentations, field-based research projects, and value-added experiments. The students are taken to Institutes of Eminence in related disciplines and field trips, excursions for practical learning outside the confines of the classroom. The department also has an active and vibrant Zoological society, 'Evolvare',

that organizes a variety of academic and extra-curricular activities throughout the year for the holistic development of students. The Society also releases an annual magazine, 'Phoenix', which provides a platform to bring out the creative expression of students. The years of undergraduate college life at the Department of Zoology in SVC helped bring out the latent talent of all students by providing a disciplined yet fun-filled environment.

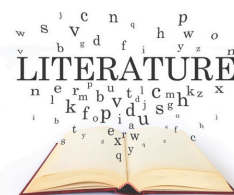

Established in 1961 under the, the Department of Tamil has been a key center for promoting Dravidian languages, literature, and the cultural heritage of Tamil Nadu in Delhi.

Dr. Kanaga Soundari Mahalingam (widely known as "Saalini"), a prolific writer and social activist, was the first faculty member appointed in the Department. Dr. V. Subramanian, an expert in Tamil Theatre and Film Studies, served the department with dedication until his demise while in service.

Dr. A. Mariappan, with expertise in Tamil Grammar, Modern Tamil Literature, Folklore, and Comparative Indian Literature, later joined the University of Delhi. Dr. T. Sethupandian, who briefly taught in the department, went on to serve as Head of the Department of Tamil Grammar. Several others, including Dr. Chithiravelu, Ms. Kalaiselvi, Dr. Senthamarai, Mrs. Meera Ashok, Mrs. Padma Thanappan, and Dr. Roselet Danny Bai, also contributed during the early years of the department.

Dr. S. Vivekananthan was appointed as a lecturer in the Department in October, 1991. He obtained his M.Phil and Doctorate degrees from Kerala University. His research interests are Tamil Manuscriptology, Tamil Folklore and Achaeology. He has published more than 25 books on his research fields and among them thirteen are critical editions on rare manuscript of Ballads. His critical edition on ‘Ayothi Ramayanam’ (2011) has been awarded as the best book in the category of Tamil Folklore for the year 2011 by the council for the Development of Tamil, Govt. of Tamil Nadu in the year 2013.

THE DEPARTMENT OF Telugu is one of the earliest established faculties in the college and is generally recognized as the most active in spreading the language and culture of Andhra Pradesh and Telangana in Delhi. As providence would have it, Sri Uppada Raja Rao, a distinguished scholar and an acclaimed poet joined the college and started its classes in 1961 with a small group of 9students in B.A. (Pass) with effective support from TTD management, University of Delhi, teaching and non-teaching staff, and a multitude of cultural organizations in the region and formulated its holistic pedagogy. He invited the celebrated Telugu poet Sri Sankarambadi Sundarachari of “maa Telugu thallikimallepoodanda” fame as the Chief Guest and founded the student association Telugu Bhasha Parishat and tarted a wall magazine, Andhri, in the same year, and edited the inaugural issue of the College’s Annual Magazine Neerajana, besides setting up a well-equipped library for staff and students. Sri H.S. Brahmananda, an eminent authority on Lambadi language and folk literature, linguistics, and literary criticism, joined the department for a year in 1975. It was later due to the sedulous attention paid by Dr. A. Anjaneyulu, who joined the faculty in 1976, that the department attained the present widespread reputation and recognition. He retired in 2006. Dr. E. Muralidhar Rao & S. Chandrasekhar, well-known scholars, contributed immensely to the educational and socio-cultural activities of Delhi ever since their appointment in 1979. He retired in 2015.

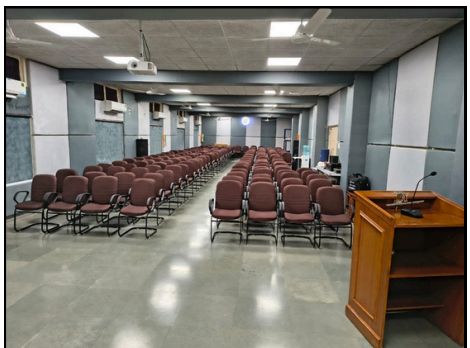
Medical facilities

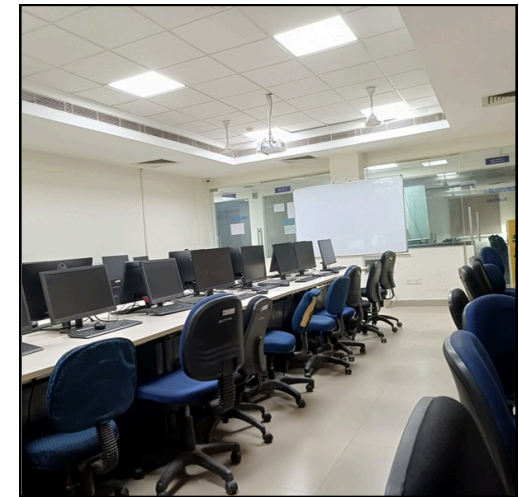
Incubation and Research Centre





Placement Cell@SVC

The University of Delhi reserves the right to revise, amend, update, or delete any part of its bulletin without prior notice. Any changes will be posted on the UG Admission website and become effective from the date they are posted.

Candidates are responsible for regularly checking the University of Delhi's websites and admission portals for updates related to CUET (UG) - 2025 and admission-related policies.

The Bulletin of Information is a compendium of inputs from various institutions and sources, but should not be construed as a warranty. The University disclaims liability for any loss or damage caused by actions based on the information.

Non-compliance with admission requirements, such as non-submission of documents or non-payment of fees, may result in loss of admission.

Common Minimum Eligibility

The candidate must have passed the Class XII or its equivalent examination from a single recognized board.

For the purpose of ascertaining the Minimum Eligibility, the marksheet/degree of only one board will be considered. (For example, if a candidate has appeared in CBSE Board Examination with five subjects except for Mathematics and later appears and passes Mathematics from another board, such as the National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS), the minimum eligibility shall be ascertained from his/her mark sheet issued by CBSE only).

Program Specific Eligibilities

Candidate must refer to the Program-Specific Eligibility to choose the subjects in which s/he should appear in CUET (UG) – 2025.

It is mandatory for the candidates to appear in CUET(UG)-2025 in those subjects in which s(he) is appearing/ has passed Class XII.

For the purpose of ascertaining Program Specific Eligibility and for mapping the CUET subject(s) with Class XII subject(s), the marksheet of more than one recognized board may be considered, provided the candidate has passed those subjects in Class XII.

CUET Eligibility

The University of Delhi's Undergraduate Programs are based on the scores obtained in the CUET (UG) - 2025, except for admissions to the School of Open Learning (SOL), Non-Collegiate Women Education Board (NCWEB), and for Foreign Nationals. Eligible candidates must have passed Class XII examination or its equivalent from a recognized board or a foreign country

If a subject is not mentioned in the CUET (UG) - 2025, the candidate must appear in a Language/Domain Specific subject that is similar or closely related to the subject. The university reserves the right to establish similarity, and the decision is final and binding.

Only the scores obtained in CUET (UG) - 2025 will be considered for admissions to the academic year 2025-26.

The University of Delhi (UD) requires candidates to match their names on their corresponding school board qualifying certificates and CUET (UG)-2025.

Parents' names must also match on the certificates. Grievances related to non-appearance in CUET (UG) - 2025 or required Language/s, Domain Specific Subjects, or General Aptitude Test (GAT) will not be entertained. Candidates should read the Bulletin of Information (BOI) 2025-26 and consult the University of Delhi Act, 1922 and the Statutes.

The University of Delhi's Ordinance-I states that there is no minimum age bar for admission to undergraduate programs, except in programs prescribed by regulatory bodies. A gap year is not a bar for admission, but candidates must appear in CUET (UG) 2025 for the academic year 2025-26.

Allocation Rules

.In the context of provisional seat allocation, 'Allocated Seat' refers to a unique combination of Program + College. For example, a "B.A. (Hons.) in Psychology at College X" is referred to as an 'Allocated Seat'.

2. The University will consider the Normalized scores provided by NTA to calculate the merit scores as per Program Specific Eligibility.

3. The Highest Possible Preference will be provisionally allocated to a candidate, considering the following criteria:

- Program-Specific merit.
- Category (UR/OBC-NCL/SC/ST/EWS/Minority).
- Availability of seats.
- Any other allocation rules, policies, or criteria as mentioned in this document (CSAS(UG)-2025), UG BOI – 2025, or published on the admission website of UoD.

4. The merit list for the UR category seats will comprise all candidates in order of merit. No one will be excluded from the same. In other words, the merit list for the Unreserved (UR) category will also include SC/ST/OBC-NCL /Minority/EWS candidates, irrespective of category, if they meet the criterion of merit for the UR category. No candidate can be excluded from the UR category merit list just because the Candidate belongs to or has applied under SC/ST/OBC-NCL/EWS/ Minority category. Discrimination on the basis of category/ caste is completely unlawful. The University of Delhi does not tolerate discrimination against any Candidate/student on this basis. Strict action will be taken against any violations.

5.If candidates belonging to SC/ST/OBC-NCL/EWS/Minority/PwBD/CW/KM/ CW/ Orphan category do not have a valid certificate/ document issued by the respective issuing authority at the time of applying to CSAS(UG)-2025, they will not be considered for allocation in the relevant category as claimed. (Details related to the category certificate issuing authority are published on the admission website).

6. If the total number of eligible ST category candidates who have applied for a particular Program exhausts, then the remaining seats under this category for that particular Program will be allocated to eligible SC category candidates and vice versa.

7. In case, a candidate who was allocated a seat under any reserved category/ sub-category and was rejected on the basis of deficiency/ies in the category/sub-category/ caste documents, he/she may be considered for seat allocation in subsequent round/s (if any) in UR category as per his/her eligibility, merit and availability of seats in UR. (Refer Chapter 5 CSAS(UG)-2025 document)

Acceptance of Provisionally Allocated Seat

Once a seat has been allocated in a particular round, the candidate must 'Accept' the Allocated Seat before the last date/time specified for the given allocation round. The provision for acceptance of a particular Allocated Seat will be valid only for the round in which the seat was allocated to the candidate. In case a candidate is offered multiple seats in a particular round, s(he) must "Accept" ONE Allocated seat ONLY. Inactivity/no-action will be taken as non-acceptance to the Allocated Seat. It will be treated as a decline to the provisionally Allocated Seat and the candidate will no longer be able to participate in subsequent rounds of CSAS(UG)-2025.

Online Approval by College

Once the candidate "Accept" the provisionally Allocated Seat, the concerned College will verify the eligibility and documents uploaded by the candidate online. The College will verify the following within the stipulated timeline: 1. Minimum Eligibility of the candidate. 2. Program-Specific Eligibility of the candidate. 3. Subject Mapping: Only those CUET(UG)-2024 Language and/ or Domain specific papers in which the candidate has passed Class XII will be considered. 4. Validity and authenticity of Documents/Certificates submitted by the candidate. During the online approval process, if a college seeks more clarity/ information from the candidate, it may raise a query to the Candidate (refer to CSAS-2024 document Section 6.3). After verification, the College will either 'Approve' or 'Reject' the provisionally Allocated Seat of the candidate. No application will be left unattended by the Colleges.

In case of approval

Once the College accords the approval, the candidate will have to pay the 'Admission Fee' (refer to CSAS-2025 document

In case of rejection

At the time of online verification, if an application gets rejected, the College will state the reason for rejection. For rejecting an application, the College will indicate any of the following reason/s: 1. Non-fulfillment of the Minimum Eligibility by the Candidate.

2. Not-fulfillment of Program-Specific Eligibility by the Candidate.

3. Not-fulfillment of the subject-mapping criteria.

4. Invalid documents/certificates submitted by the candidate.

5. Failure to respond to the query(ies) raised by the College within the stipulated time.

Response to Query (if any) raised by College

During the online approval process, if a College raises a query(ies) then the candidate must respond online (through the candidate's dashboard) within the stipulated time. Failure to respond to the query(ies) will lead to rejection of the Allocated Seat and the candidate will be out of CSAS(UG)-2025

Admission to Provisionally Allocated Seat

After the College approves, the candidate will have to pay the Admission Fee for the approved seat. The admission process will be treated as complete only after successful payment of the admission fee.

If a candidate fails to pay the admission fee within the stipulated time, it will be considered as a cancellation of the provisionally Allocated Seat. The Allocated Seat shall be forfeited and the candidate will not be considered for any subsequent CSAS(UG)- 2025 allocation rounds. The candidate will forfeit all the rights of the allocated seat and will not be considered for any subsequent CSAS(UG)-2025 allocation rounds.

Subsequent Round of Allocation

Based on the availability of the seats that arise due to rejections, cancellations, and withdrawals, the University may announce multiple allocation rounds. The UoD will display the vacant seats on its admission website (admission.uod.ac.in) before every allocation round. All candidates who have applied for CSAS-2025 will be eligible for all allocation rounds, except those whose allocated seat/admission has been canceled for whatever reason. All admitted candidates who opt for the "Upgrade" option in a particular round will be considered for respective CSAS-2025 allocation round, subject to the availability of seats. Candidates who were allocated their first preference in any round will not be considered in subsequent rounds of allocation

Admission Fee guidelines

Note-

It is pertinent to mention here that the Examination Fee for M.Sc. courses depends on the number of Theory and Practical papers opted by the candidate, and the fee shall be charged accordingly.

No Examination Fee shall be charged from the candidates belonging to the Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD) categories, as per university rules.

The candidates admitted provisionally to any undergraduate course in the college, under the following categories, are directed to submit the mandatory certificates/documents at the time of admission to Undergraduate Courses for availing Fee Waiver/Fee Concession as per rules:

I. Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD)

Disability Certificate issued by the Competent Authority. Consequent upon the amendment to Ordinance X (4) of the University, the following provision has been added after Sub-clause 2 of Ordinance X (4) of the said Ordinance:

“Provided that the Persons with Physical Disabilities shall be waived off all the fees payable including the Examination fee and other University fees, except Admission fee, subscription towards Delhi University Students’ Union and Identity Card fee for pursuing undergraduate, postgraduate or other courses in the University or its Colleges.”

In view of the above, the students with physical disabilities pursuing various courses of study in the Faculties, Departments, Centers, and Institutions/Colleges of the University shall be exempted from payment of fees, including examination fee and other University fees, except Admission fee, subscription towards Delhi University Students’ Union and Identity Card fee.

In pursuance of the Executive Council Resolution No. 50 dated 03.11.2012, it is notified that the students with physical disabilities residing in different Hostels/Halls of the University are exempted from payment of all hostel fees and charges except refundable caution fee and the mess fees. The Persons with Physical Disabilities students shall pay 50% of the Mess fee and the remaining 50% of the Mess Fee in respect of the PwBD students is being met by the University. Similar norms are to be adopted by the College in respect of PwBD Students residing in the hostels of the College.

II. Scheduled Caste (SC)/Scheduled Tribe (ST)

SC/ST Certificate (in the name of the candidate) along with the Income Certificate issued by the Competent Authority for concession/waiver of Fee i.e., Admission and Tuition Fee. The certificate must testify that their parents are not Income Tax Payees, as per University letter number SPLC/Fee Exemp/SC/ST/2015-16 dated 09th September, 2015 received from the Assistant Registrar (Special Cell), University of Delhi, Delhi.

III. Children of Sri Venkateswara College Employee(s)

Employment Certificate issued by the college testifying that their parent is a Sri Venkateswara College employee.

IV. Tibetan Candidates

The Tibetan candidates are exempted from paying the University Registration fee and additional fee payable to the College/Department as Foreign Candidates, as per University letter number DYDFS/FSR/2973 dated 09th July, 2014 received from the Deputy Dean (Foreign Candidates Registry), University of Delhi, Delhi.

V. Foreign Candidates

Foreign Candidates must pay an additional \$200 (USD) as Registration Fee, in addition to the prescribed course fee.

VI. Caution Deposit

A Caution Deposit of ₹500/- only is refundable.

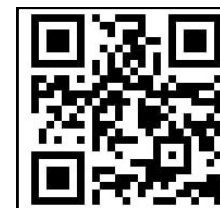

Freeship/ Student Aid



The Free Ship and Students Aid Committee aims to provide financial assistance to deserving students in the form of partial reimbursement of fees paid by the students pursuing undergraduate or postgraduate degree courses from the college. The process includes inviting online applications from the students, followed by a rigorous verification process by a duly constituted Staff Council Committee. The College provides freeships to all deserving students on the basis of their financial situation, academic performance, regularity, socio-economic status, and other relevant factors. During 2024-25, an amount of Rs. 30,69,800 was reimbursed to 363 deserving students. This is apart from the Korea Hana Scholarship of Rs. 42,398 each received by 21 students. Two endowments were instituted this year in the name of the late Dr. Jita Mishra and Cheistha Kochhar .

Fee Refund Policy 2025-26

On account of withdrawal of the admission by the candidate, full admission fee will be refunded only if the withdrawal has been made before the last date of admission, as announced by UoD. Admission fees for withdrawals done after the last date of admission will not be refunded under any circumstances. Refunds will not be done for the following:

- a) CSAS(UG)-2025 Application Fee.
- b) Mid - Entry Fee.
- c) Withdrawal Fee.

On the closure of admissions, refund process will be initiated. The UoD will try to settle the refunds within three months of closure of admissions.

ORDINANCE XV-B

Maintenance of discipline among Students of the University

✓ Powers and Authority:

- The Vice-Chancellor holds the ultimate authority over student discipline.
- Power can be delegated to the Proctor, Principals, Heads of Departments, and Faculty Deans.

⊘ Acts Considered as Gross Indiscipline:

- Physical assault or threats against any student/staff.
- Carrying or threatening to use weapons.
- Violation of Civil Rights Protection Act, 1976.
- Any action that disrespects the dignity of Scheduled Castes and Tribes or is derogatory to women.
- Acts of bribery, corruption, or willful destruction of property.
- Promoting communal hatred, religious intolerance, or academic disruption.
- Ragging (prohibited under Ordinance XV-C).

● Possible Disciplinary Actions:

- Expulsion or rustication for a specific period.
- Denial of admission to any course or program.
- Fines, exam bans, or cancellation of exam results.
- Heads of institutions can exercise discipline within their domain or delegate it to teachers.

✦ Student Declaration:

- At the time of admission, every student must sign a declaration accepting the disciplinary jurisdiction of the university and its authorities.

Anti-Ragging Policy

ORDINANCE XV-C

Prohibition and Punishment for Ragging

⊘ Definition of Ragging:

- Any act where senior students assert dominance over juniors, especially newly enrolled students.
- Includes:
 - Physical assault or threats.
 - Insulting behavior targeting caste, tribe, or gender.
 - Verbal abuse, indecent gestures, obscene conduct, or any act that harms self-esteem.

🔊 Zero-Tolerance Policy:

- Ragging is strictly prohibited within university premises, affiliated colleges, hostels, and even in public transport.
- Considered a criminal offense under Indian Law.

⚖️ Authorities Responsible for Action:

- Principal, Head of Department, or University Hostel authorities must take immediate action on ragging reports.
- The Proctor can also initiate investigations suo moto.

🔒 Punishments for Ragging:

- Rustication or expulsion for a specific number of years.
- Ban on admission, cancellation of results, or bar from university exams.
- If already graduated, degree or diploma may be withdrawn.

UGC Regulations on Prevention of Sexual Harassment

ORDINANCE XV-D

UGC Regulations on Prevention of Sexual Harassment in Higher Educational Institutions (2015)

1. Scope & Definitions

- Applicability: All higher educational institutions (HEIs) in India, including universities, colleges, and deemed universities.
- Key Definitions:
 - Sexual Harassment: Unwelcome acts like physical/verbal advances, demand for sexual favors, or creating a hostile environment.
 - Aggrieved Woman: Any woman (employee/student) alleging harassment.
 - Campus: Includes physical premises, field trips, transport, and extended activities.

2. Institutional Responsibilities

- Mandatory Measures:
 - Constitute an Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) with a senior woman faculty as Presiding Officer, faculty/student members, and an NGO representative.
 - Publicly display anti-harassment policies, penalties, and ICC contact details.
 - Conduct gender sensitization programs and ensure zero tolerance.
- Supportive Actions:
 - Provide safe infrastructure (lighting, transport, hostels), counseling, and medical facilities.
 - Protect complainants from retaliation and ensure confidentiality.

3. Complaint Redressal Process

- Filing a Complaint:
 - Written complaint to ICC within 3 months (extendable by 3 months).
 - Complaints can be filed by relatives/friends if the victim is incapacitated.

- Interim Relief: Transfer, leave, or restraining orders for the accused during inquiry.

4. Penalties & Compensation

- For Employees: Punishment as per service rules (e.g., suspension, termination).
- For Students: Rustication, restricted campus access, or community service.
- Compensation: Based on mental trauma, medical expenses, and loss of opportunities.

5. Consequences for Non-Compliance

HEIs failing to comply may face:

- Withdrawal of UGC grants or affiliation.
- Public declaration of non-compliance.
- Legal action under the UGC Act, 1956.

6. Key Amendments (2017)

- A Sub-Committee (Pro-VC, Proctor, EC member) was authorized to expedite ICC recommendations

Attendance Criteria

The attendance rules for students admitted to the Four Year Undergraduate Programme are as follows:

1. A candidate for the Semester I/III/V/VII Examination must attend at least two-thirds of the required lectures, practicals, presentations, and tutorials in all subjects. If a student does not meet the required conditions but attends 40% of lectures, practicals, and tutorials, they may appear for the ensuing semester examination at the discretion of the Principal.

2. A student of the II/IV/VI semester who does not meet the required conditions but attends 40% of lectures, practicals, and tutorials may appear at the ending examination, provided they make up the deficiency by combining the previous semester's attendance in the ensuing semester.

3. A student of the IV/VI/VIII semester who seeks a Diploma/Bachelor's degree may appear at the IV/VI/VIII Semester Examination if they have two-thirds of attendance in all subjects held during the respective years.

Note: For students who are selected as members of the N.C.C., participate in public assignments, participate in sports, represent the college in inter-college tournaments, participate in periodical training, or participate in curricular activities, the total number of lectures delivered in the student's course of study in each academic year is considered attended during the period of absence, as approved by the Principal/Head.

4. The Principal may consider medical certificates for exceptionally hard cases of students who have fallen seriously ill or experienced an accident, determining whether lectures can be excluded for the calculation of attendance.

5. Colleges must notify their students' attendance positions on the notice board and website, clearly indicating the number of lectures, practicals, presentations, and tutorials held. The final attendance position of each student must be announced within five days of class dispersal in the last session of the academic year.

6. The benefit of exclusion of lectures cannot exceed 1/3 of the total number of lectures delivered. Maternal leave for a married student is not considered in the calculation of lectures.

7. The Principal has the power to detain or not send a student to the same class or university examination if they do not appear or perform poorly.

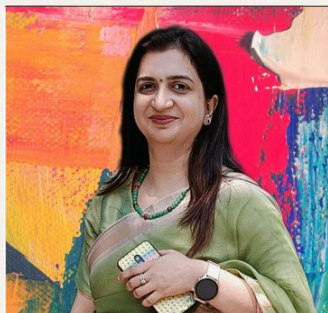

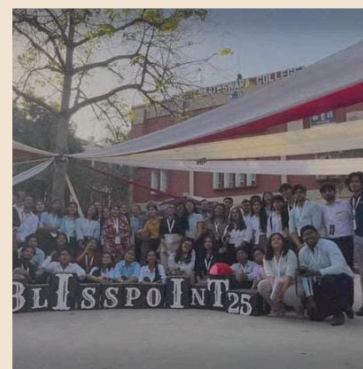

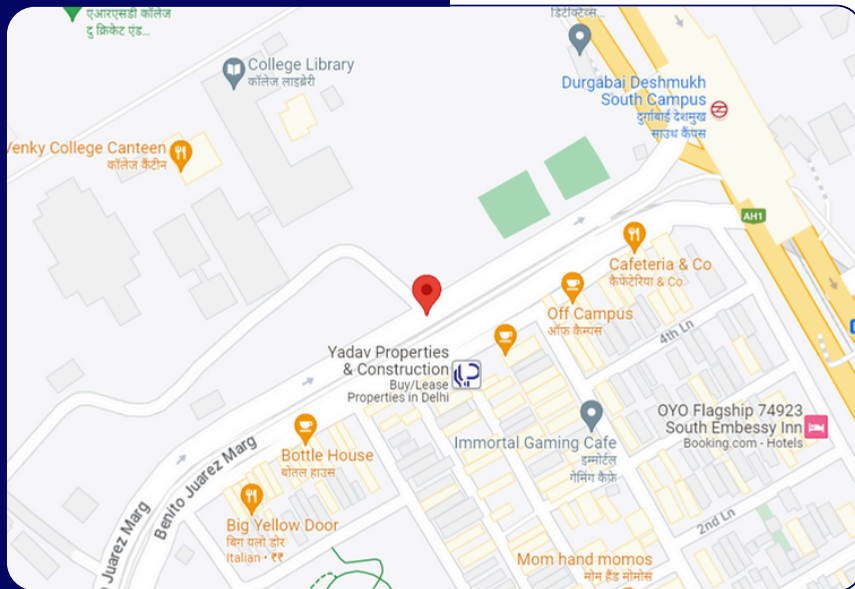
